PARENTS OF CURRENT 7TH GRADE STUDENTS -

In recent years we have heard from parents that students are spending more and more time at home doing school work with their family computers. As part of the EPS 5-Year Instructional Technology Plan approved by the school board this past October, next year's 8th grade students (current 7th grade students) will receive an individual Chromebook for educational use next fall. The district is finding that much of our educational content requires access to technology, and Chromebooks allow us a cost-effective way to assure that students have this access when it is needed. Next steps of this plan will include Chromebooks for high school students beginning in the fall of 2018. Much work is being done for this initiative and more information will be sent as we get closer to next fall.

As part of this initiative, Parents of 2017-18 eighth grade students will need to attend an orientation either during Back to School 101 or Open House in August. The exact dates for these orientations are not yet set, but the district wanted to begin communication with 7th grade parents. We are very excited about providing every 8th grade student with a computing device next school year.

STANDARDIZED ACHIEVEMENT TESTING AT EMS

Students at EMS will have an important stretch of standardized testing beginning April 3rd. ALL students will be taking the state reading test (NeSA-ELA), state math test (NeSA-M), and a series of tests known as MAP. Eighth graders will also be taking the state science test (NeSA-S). The following is a summary of the testing schedule:

<u>April 3—6</u>: ALL students at Elkhorn Middle School will take the state reading test (NeSA-ELA). The state reading test consists of two sections.

<u>April 10 —13</u>: ALL students will be taking the state math test (NeSA-M). The state math test consists of two sections.

April 17-20: 8th Grade students will take the state science test (NeSA-S). The state science test consists of two sections.

<u>May 1—4 and May 8—11</u>: All students will take MAP. This is the second administration of the MAP test this year and will show the growth of each student from fall to spring.

These are all very important assessments that truly allow us to measure the academic growth of each student. Please assure that your child is getting plenty of sleep and eating breakfast each morning. If you have any questions regarding these assessments please contact Mrs. Garrison or Mrs. Owens.

6TH GRADE NEWS

In Language Arts, students are in the midst of practicing District Text Dependent Analysis. After spring break, we will begin a mechanics unit that focuses on capitalization, quotation marks, and commas. Students who want additional writing practice can continue to use the "Writer's Corner" and "Learn at Home" sections of Mrs. Young's website to find writing contests and activities.

Sixth grade math students will be working with integers. After that they will be working with 3D images.

Pre-Concept students will be graphing linear and nonlinear equations as well as determining slope.

Reading students are studying the elements of fictional and nonfictional genres. They will review story elements and continue to work on identifying and explaining why authors use literary devices.

Social studies students will study Geography, focusing on the Five Themes of Geography and then move onto Urban Geography and the study of the history of Omaha.

In science we will be learning about the different Kingdoms of the living world. Students will learn what type of organisms are in each Kingdom and their niche in their ecosystem.



7TH GRADE NEWS

In Science, 7th graders are beginning the Motion and Forces unit. In this unit, we begin studying speed, velocity and acceleration. We will also investigate the 3 Laws of Motion, gravity and friction.

In Language Arts we will end 3rd quarter and begin 4th quarter with a research project. Students will be writing persuasive essays about living legends and defending them in a class debate. This project will focus on research, paraphrasing, and persuasive writing skills.

Seventh grade math classes have just finished all operations of fractions as well as using formulas for finding area and perimeter of many shapes. Next, we will be preparing for our last district common assessment, which covers all operations of fractions and decimals. We are also preparing for our NeSa-M tests which will begin in April.

Pre-Algebra classes have just finished a graphing unit. We will be starting a unit on Geometry and also preparing for NeSA-M tests.

We will finish up the Middle Ages, and then move on to the Renaissance and Reformation.

In Reading we are finishing our unit on figurative language before moving into some NeSA review after spring break. AR goals for the third quarter are due on Friday, March 10th.
