From the High School Principal- Mark Kalvoda

As we move into the winter months, the students and staff of Elkhorn South eagerly anticipate the start of the second semester and the excitement that comes with it. The first semester has been full of opportunities, successes, and learning experiences. Our students have faced adversity and challenges, but have persevered. Second semester offers new challenges and new experiences, but also affords students a fresh start if needed.

At the conclusion of the 1st Quarter, ESHS proudly honored students for achieving 3.25 and above grade point averages. Of the 787 Honor Roll students, 275 achieved 4.0 GPA's for the first quarter. On November 3rd, ESHS paused from the normal schedule to honor these high achieving students with the ESHS Honors Convocation. In addition to celebrating the Honor Roll students, ESHS teachers also nominated students for Elkhorn Excellence awards. 68 students were awarded Elkhorn Excellence Awards for showing extreme effort, exemplifying strong integrity, having first-class character or going out of their way to assist others...essentially Elkhorn Excellence awards are designed to honor those students who make ESHS a better place to be. As principal at ESHS, I am very proud of our students' efforts so far this year and enjoy taking a moment from the typical day to give them an Elkhorn South Excellence t-shirt and to personally thank them for their contributions to the culture of high expectations here at Elkhorn South. Special thanks to ESHS Senior Nick Lee for designing this year's Excellence Shirts.

In the winter months, it is common to see more student absences due to illnesses, family trips and the like. We speak frequently with our students about the importance of instructional time and generally see a dip in achievement from students who miss class time. Instructional time is paramount to student success and nearly impossible to replicate outside of the classroom. Please be thoughtful in planning family vacations and other extended absences from school. In the best interest of students' educational achievement, please plan vacations and family trips around the school calendar whenever possible and encourage your students to strive for perfect attendance. The average Elkhorn South student missed just over six days of school and we were proud to honor 32 students with perfect attendance for the entire 2016-17 school year. Please reflect upon your student's attendance in comparison to our averages here at ESHS.

In the event that your child misses school for a professional appointment, such as orthodontist, physician or the like, please provide the school with documentation of this appointment when your student returns to school. This proactive piece of record-keeping will serve invaluable if your student exceeds eight absences per semester. Thank you for your cooperation.

Elkhorn South will have finals week to conclude the first semester. Cumulative final exams are an integral part of assessing student learning and simulate the college finals experience. In order to protect the integrity of the exams which are aligned across departments in both high schools, **no finals will be proctored before the assigned times**. Please make every attempt to ensure that your student is present for finals week to fully prepare and achieve at the highest levels. Please contact the administration in the extreme case that your student will not be in school for finals.

Semester finals will be on Thursday, December 21st and Friday, December 22nd. Students will take semester finals in periods 1,3,5 on Thursday and periods 2, 4, 6, 7 on Friday. Please note that these are full days with **no early dismissal times**. Students will have preparatory time built into this two day adjusted schedule, but please also communicate with your student the importance of being prepared for the cumulative final exams. **Students may not be called out during finals periods, even if they are finished with their exam. Students are expected to be at school all seven periods both finals days.** Please encourage your student to utilize study periods on finals days and help us curb students signing out during these periods. Thank you for your cooperation.

****Please Note-** No School for students on Wednesday, January 3rd for teacher in-service day. Second semester begins Thursday, January 4th.

SAVE THE DATE: APRIL 3rd

The ACT will be given at no cost to students in 11th grade, and results can be used to meet admission requirements for most 4-year and community colleges. Below are a few highlights of our initial planning.

Tuesday, APRIL 3rd

- 9th and 10th grade students will take the PreACT test in the morning, with a likely early dismissal for the afternoon. Lunch will not be served.
- ALL 11th grade students need to be in attendance to take the ACT, with an early dismissal for afternoon. Lunch will not be served (Note, if students are absent, they will attend make-up testing on April 24th).
- 12th grade students will not report to school. Seniors are encouraged to participate in community service activities, but plans for the day will be a family decision.

We will continue to communicate additional information as plans are finalized. For now, we ask families to save the date and avoid travel or appointments for April 3rd. Elkhorn South is very pleased that the state is offering this ACT opportunity for all students and we believe it is our obligation to help students reach their ACT goals.

Standardized Test Interpretation

PSAT TEST

JUNIOR AUDITS

During third quarter, each junior will meet individually with his/her counselor to go over graduation progress, begin course discussions for senior year, and discuss college planning. Juniors are strongly encouraged to access their Naviance accounts (<http://connection.naviance.com/elkhorn>) for access to college and career planning.

College Entrance Testing: For Juniors

A common question from junior parents this time of year centers around when juniors should take the ACT. Most students test two or three times before they graduate.

This year, ACT will be administered to ALL juniors on Tuesday, April 3. ACT offers Saturday test dates on February 10, April 14, and June 9 and July 14. For many juniors, the April 3 test date may be the only time the student tests during junior year. Other juniors may want to consider taking the February, June, or July test. For advice on what is most appropriate for your student, please feel free to contact your counselor. Register for Saturday tests online at www.actstudent.org. Registration deadlines are approximately one month prior to the test date and are found at ACT's website.

Important note about score reporting: It is the student's responsibility to submit test scores to colleges of choice. Upon registration for the test, students select up to 4 colleges to receive test scores. To avoid paying to send your scores later, please ensure that you have selected 4 colleges of your choice at the time of registration.

Applications

A good goal is to have applications completed before winter break. Be sure to check deadlines. The counseling center is closed over Winter Break, so all transcript requests must be made prior to Winter Break if you are working on a Jan. 1 deadline. When completing applications, double check all things needed. Check if a separate application for scholarships is required. Don't hesitate to call the admissions office or see your counselor with questions.

Scholarships

Check Naviance – www.connection.naviance.com/elkhorn. There will be many new scholarships posted in December and January. All students planning on attending a 2-year or 4-year school should be looking.

College Financial Aid Forms (FAFSA)

Colleges will use your FAFSA results to determine how much they will award you in financial aid. FAFSA opened up on October 1, so senior families should be working on this NOW. To estimate your FAFSA results, use the *College Funding Estimator* at EducationQuest.org.

THE PARENT'S ROLE IN ATHLETICS- "What is appropriate parental support?"

News Article-"Tips for Parents"

Parents are vitally important in the development of their son's or daughters athletic involvement. Their trust, support, counseling, and physical presence helps to create the support base student athletes need in order to compete both mentally and physically throughout the season. Parent support, appropriately utilized, is a strong booster of confidence for athletes, increases loyalty and enthusiasm for the athlete, and is a vital asset for any coach.

One of the most important support actions for parents is to encourage and assist players and coaches to help themselves when solving problems during the season. Parents should know problems can and do occur during the season and accept that aspect of competitive athletics. Throughout the season, parents must give total support to the coach and to the athletic program, just as athletes must give 100% of their loyalty to their program and coach. If problems do occur, parents should allow the athlete and the coach the opportunity to work through problems. If parents show disloyalty to the coach or the program, they transmit the negative message to their children that the athletic program and/or the coach is now somehow incorrect, and immediately the athlete is placed in a situation where it becomes a right vs. wrong decision, and at a minimum, produces a "grey area" with many question marks.

We have all been placed in these situations, and sometimes it's tough to see your child fail. Most of us would agree, however, that in the long run, things normally work out for the best. Please help your student/athlete to make good decisions about problems and to correctly handle the many questions that arise during any sports season. Remember the phrase, "Alone we can do so little, together we can accomplish so much."

Tech Tips: Internet Safety Tips

Taking an active role in protecting your kids from Internet predators and explicit materials is vital to keeping them safe. Below are some helpful tips and ways parents can stay involved and aware in order to ensure their children's safety online.

Become computer literate and learn how to block questionable material.

Keep the computer in a common area, not in individual bedrooms, where you can watch and monitor its use.

Share an email account with your child so you can monitor messages.

Bookmark kids' favorite sites for easy access.

Spend time online together to teach your kids appropriate online behavior.

Block private chat rooms by using safety features provided by your Internet service provider or with special filtering software.

Be aware that posting messages to chat rooms reveals a user's email address to others.

Take your child seriously if he or she reports an uncomfortable online exchange.

Forward copies of obscene or threatening messages you or your kids get to your Internet service provider.

Tech tips continued...

- Call the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children at (800) 843-5678 if you're aware of the transmission, use, or viewing of child pornography online. Contact your local law enforcement agency or the FBI if your child has received child pornography via the Internet. Ask your Internet service provider about disabling "cookies" that track specific user information including a user's name and email address.

Keeping children safe online is an on-going task that requires diligence in the monitoring of online activities and usage. In order to best protect them, parents must remain vigilant and always know what their child is doing online

Apps to Know

While parents know that nearly all mobile devices used today have the ability to send and receive text messages, they may not fully understand that beyond that inherent, built-in ability, students are also able to download additional apps that are specifically used for sending and receiving text messages. Below are some popular texting apps and concerns that are linked to their use. For more information on any of these apps, please visit: www.common sense media.org.

GroupMe: allows individual and group messages with no user fees or limits. Users are able to send and receive photos, videos, and calendar links.

Concern: embedded GIFs included in the app have adult themes that are not suitable for children under the age of 18.

Kik Messenger: ability to send and receive limitless messages that do not show up on an individual's phone messaging service

Concern: allows users the ability to connect with anyone who shares their Kik username, opening up the pathway for online predators

UNO Problem Solving Math Competition

Elkhorn South students attended the University of Nebraska-Omaha Problem Solving Math Contest on October 27th. UNO had 37 schools attend and 416 students compete. TEAM+S (Tests of Engineering Aptitude, Mathematics, and Science)

Students will be selected to compete in the TEAM+S engineering contest Tuesday Feb 27 at UNL. The 2018 theme is "Engineering a Greener World". Scenarios will focus on topics such as: durability of materials, economics of green engineering, efficiency of solar power, global health, green energy basics, green building practices, insects and climate change, light pollution, and solar energy. Students work collaboratively in groups of 8 as they apply their math and science knowledge in practical, creative ways to solve realistic engineering problems. Thank you to our **awesome** health screen volunteers. We couldn't have done it without you!

If your child had results that indicated a need for further evaluation, you should be receiving those referrals in the mail. Please return a copy of the completed referral, so I can update your student's health information. Thank you!

As we head into the winter months, we see an increase in cold and flu symptoms. Please keep your child home if they have a fever of 100* or greater, vomiting/diarrhea, persistent cough, unknown rashes, pink eye, or in general not feeling well. This helps your child get well faster, and helps reduce the spread of germs.


