Register (kindergarten or students new to Westridge)

- 1. Enter your email address and push "Login/Create Account".
- 2. Fill in the required fields and register.
- 3. For each child, enter your child's first and last name, with no space, for the Student ID (example: JohnSmith) and Birth Date (example: 12/15/2005).

Sign In

If you've previously registered, all you need to do is enter your email address and password. The system will know about your appointments and the children you have added to your account.

Scheduling

- 1. Each colored square represents an available meeting time. The legend/key shows what each color means. Click on a square to book that time.
- 2. As an option, you have the choice of setting a time when you would like a reminder email delivered.
- 3. Click "Create Appointment" to finalize.

Repeat until you have a time for each of your children.

*At any time, you can click on "**printable schedule**" and print the resulting web page to get a hard copy of your schedule. You will also have the option to email your schedule to yourself.

*You have the ability to change your conference time through October

- 15th. You will need to log in with the email address and password you used to create your account. If you need to make a change after October 15th, you will need to contact the office at 402-289-2559. *Click on "Your Schedule" to display and hide your appointments. There will be links to change the time or cancel the appointment.

Ouestion of the Month

What do I do if my child is sick or going to be absent from school?



We know that regular attendance at school is critical to students being able to reach their full potential. Students who maintain regular attendance develop responsibility, remain current with their class work, and receive the most benefit from the school day. However, there are times that students will not be in attendance for a variety of reasons.

When a student must be absent from school for illness, travel, family emergency, or medical appointments, parents are to call the school on the day of the absence and report their child's absence. If you know in advance of the absence, parents can call ahead of time, and even email the classroom teacher. This will allow the teacher time to plan for the student being gone. It gives the teacher time to get homework pulled together or get any work or tests that need to be done at school completed in a timely manner. We ask that parents notify the school by 9:30 AM on the day of the absence to eliminate any doubt as to the student's location.

It can be hard sometimes to know if you should or should not send your child to school. The district policy states that students should stay home if they have the following: contagious disease, suspicious skin rash, vomiting and/or diarrhea, temperature above 100 degrees, or head lice. Students do need to be fever free for 24 hours before returning to school.

<u>Tech Tips for Building Newsletters – October 2017</u>

SchoolMessenger – Are You Up to Date?

EPS uses a parent messaging system called SchoolMessenger to send emails and phone calls to parents. To ensure you are receiving important messages from your school, be sure to let the office know of any changes to your email addresses or phone numbers.

YouTube - A Guide to Understanding Your Child's Video Watching

YouTube is a common video watching platform used by many youths to find content on subjects that they find interesting or enjoyable to watch. In order to have a better understanding of what your child is watching on YouTube, below is a list of questions that you can ask:

- 1) What's trending today? Trending videos appear on YouTube's home page and show the most recent viral videos, what's funny, and what's being shared. Knowing what's trending will give parents a better understanding of the type of content your child is being exposed to by them simply going to the YouTube home page.
- 2) What channels do you subscribe to? If a child is taking the time to subscribe to a specific channel, it's a guarantee that the content being shown is something of interest to them. Get involved and find out what those channels are, so you can get a better idea of what specific content your child finds interesting and why. This could turn out to be a significant subject area interest for your child and a good common ground topic for conversations.
- 3) What's in your library? One's YouTube library is the place where videos that the user has liked or shared are stored. This too, is a way to discover content that your child finds interesting.
- 4) What was the last video you shared? Youth share things with others only when they find them to be interesting or enjoyable, or they feel that others will enjoy them as well. Get a glimpse into what videos are catching their attention by asking this question.

Recently we have seen an increased number of requests for information regarding the importance of limiting screen time and engaging kids in other activities. Please read the below article regarding one idea that can be used to transition from a technology-filled day to a device-free night.

Device Free Dinner

Did you know that 92% of parents feel that quality conversations at dinner time are essential to connecting with their kids? Yet many worry that devices at the table are taking away from those moments. Curbing technology and device use at the table, including restaurants and not just home, is vital to keeping the conversation going and helping kids see that what's going on in their lives matters. Below are a few ways families can implement a device free dinner and connect over mealtimes:

- 1. "What was the best thing that happened to you today?" Get kids talking about their day and discover what brings them joy or what type of things make an impact on their day. It's this type of conversation that may just open your eyes to a new topic or activity that your child has recently discovered. Take this opportunity to find out what activities your child finds enjoyable, who they hang out with, etc.
- 2. It's Your Turn, Pick A Topic. Giving each member of the family a chance to choose the topic of conversation allows each individual to express themselves and gives insight into what's going on in each person's head. This can be done during every meal, where each member chooses a topic and it is discussed for a set amount of time, or it can be a daily opportunity, where each day, a different family member gets to choose the topic of conversation for the duration of the meal. Either way, make sure every individual participates, even if it's simply acknowledging a new area of interest for the family member that chose the topic.

3. Practice What You Preach. Kids follow the example of those around them, so parents taking phone calls and responding to emails or texts during dinner only shows them that the rules you put into place only apply to others. Show your children that you are taking the initiative seriously and give them your undivided attention. That phone call can be returned and the text message can certainly wait, and by doing so, you're showing your child that they matter to you more than the person on the other end of line.

Whether it is a sit-down meal at your family table or a quick run through the drive through, avoiding the use of technology during dinnertime guarantees that families have the daily opportunity to connect with each other. Take the time to listen and learn about every family members' day, you never know what new thing you might learn from it.

Portable PowerSchool

PowerSchool has gone mobile! The PowerSchool for Parents app is available for download from the Apple App Store and Google Play. Parents can easily view each child's progress in a single feed to check grades, review assignments and more. After downloading the app, enter code BFTS to find Elkhorn Public Schools and then log in using your PowerSchool parent access login. This app is only available for parents of students in grades 4-12 (4th grade parents cannot access until after the conclusion of the 1st quarter).

HEALTH SCREENING - ALL K-4TH GRADERS AND STUDENTS NEW TO THE DISTRICT

School health screening is not diagnostic nor is it intended to replace regular preventative health care. The goal is to assist parents in the identification of potential health problems so they may seek appropriate medical evaluation. The annual health screening will include: height, weight, BMI, vision (near & far), hearing and dental for all K-4th grade students and new students to the district. Students may be screened upon the request of a parent or teacher at any time. Students with abnormal results at the initial screening will be re-screened by the school nurse and a parent will be notified of abnormal re-screening results. Our annual screening this year is set for Thursday November 9th at 8:30am. Please be sure to wear any corrective lenses on the date of the screening in order to avoid rescreening at a later date. Thank you!!



OUR PROGRAM

The Elkhorn Public Schools Partners in Education Mentoring Program differs from other mentoring programs in two key ways:

1) Academically-focused: the primary goal of mentors in our program is to assist students with their academic needs and curriculum understanding.

2) Based at school:

all mentoring sessions occur during school hours. This ensures that the focus remains on academics. Mentors are welcome to meet with their mentees outside of school hours if permission is granted by the mentee's guardians.

By focusing primarily on academics, our students are regularly reminded of the importance of education.

THE MENTORING IMPACT

Mentors help keep students in school - studies show that students who meet regularly with their mentors or 52% less likely than their peers to skip a day of school and 37% less likely to skip a class.

Mentors can improve academic skills by assisting in developing positive study habits and growing a passion for learning. The development of these skills increases the likelihood of students going on to pursue a higher education and improves attitudes towards education and learning.

Youth who meet regularly with their mentors see them as role models and are generally 46% less likely than their peers to start using illegal drugs and 27% less likely to start drinking due to a mentor's positive influence.

- Provide academic support at the appropriate level
- Be a positive role model
- Provide guided/independent practice
- Reinforce classroom objectives, skills, and strategies
