WELCOME BACK FROM SUPERINTENDENT DR. BARY HABROCK



Each new school year brings a renewed sense of possibility, promise, excitement, and hope. We return to school this month proud of what has already been achieved in the Elkhorn Public Schools – in classrooms, competitive venues, and stages. We celebrate these achievements and prepare for even greater successes this year.

The Elkhorn Public Schools is the collective effort of so many, including: dedicated students who give their best each day, nurturing and supportive parents, caring teachers who teach with passion and purpose, committed support staff, thoughtful board members, and a community that sets the highest priority and expectations for the education of our youth. This long-standing partnership of community expectation has been the guidepost for our district of rural roots to grow into a premier school district.

Student achievement remains the core value that informs our actions and decisions in the district. Our students consistently score well-above state and national averages. We have two nationally recognized high schools that maintain an outstanding graduation rate with almost all going on to higher learning. Last fall, a record 8,408 students in grades K-12 brought enrollment up by more than 7.6 percent from the prior year and made 2016 the 30th consecutive year of district growth. The board of education and administration continue to focus our planning in response to this growth, requiring additional classroom space at all levels - elementary, middle and high school - in the near future.

In closing, I am honored to serve as the superintendent of the Elkhorn Public Schools. Only together can we ensure every student thrives in school and is prepared to write their future story beyond our system. High School, Grades 9-12 Modified First Day 9th Grade: 8:10am - 11:45am 10th-12th Grade: 12pm - 3:20pm

Buses will run regular schedules for elementary and middle school students. High school bus routes will run on the regular schedule with an additional drop off when freshman are dismissed at 11:45 a.m. Students in grades 10-12 who ride the bus will need to make alternate arrangements to arrive at school by 12 p.m.



REGISTRATION INFORMATION

NEW STUDENT REGISTRATION

New Student Registration will be held at all Elkhorn **The below items are required for registration:** Schools on Wednesday, August 2 and Thursday, August 3 from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Please call your school office the week prior to set up a new student 3. Immunization Record - immunizations for registration appointment. If you are unsure of your school assignment, visit elkhornweb.org or call the EPS Administration Building at (402) 289-2579.



- 1. Birth Certificate (all grade levels)
- 2. Proof of district residence (all grade levels)
- poliomyelitis, diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus, hepatitis B (all grades), and two doses of MMR (measles, mumps, rubella) are required for all students. A new state requirement also mandates that students must provide proof of two varicella (chicken pox) immunizations or proof that they have had the disease.

PLEASE NOTE: proof of immunization is required before attendance is allowed.

- 4. Current physical examination and visual examination documentation (within six months) is required for all kindergartners and seventh graders; this is also mandated for all students who enroll from out of state.
- 5. For foster children or wards of the state or court, court documents and pertinent school records must be provided prior to admission.
- 6. School records from previous schools (all grades).

DISTRICT GROWTH AND EXPANSION

A quickly expanding district is not a new concept for the Elkhorn Public Schools as families continue to see the Elkhorn school district as a premier destination for education. The district has experienced over 30 consecutive years of growth, with an average increase of 7.5% annually for the past five years. This means that annually there are 500-600 new students starting in the district in August that were not here the May prior. Projected growth in upcoming years continues to climb, with significant development expansions occurring in the following areas within our district boundaries:

- Northwest Development 382 platted lots
- Northeast Development 2765 platted lots, 800 apartments
- Southeast Development 2243 apartments
- Southwest Development 1498 platted lots

With an expectation of even greater continued growth in the coming years, the Board of Education and district administration continue to monitor projections and develop a plan to best serve a growing school district. A converging need for classroom space at all levels is quickly developing as several school buildings are approaching maximum capacity which will require expanded and new buildings throughout the district, including a third high school in the near future.
