BACK TO SCHOOL INFORMATION

NEW STUDENT REGISTRATION

New Student Registration will be held at all Elkhorn schools on Monday, July 30 and Tuesday, July 31 from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Please call your school office the week prior to set up a new student registration appointment. If you are unsure of your school assignment, visit https://www.elkhornweb.org/ or call the EPS Administration Building at (402) 289-2579.

The below items are required for registration:

- 1. Birth Certificate (all grade levels)
- 2. Proof of district residence (all grade levels)
- 3. Immunization Record immunizations for poliomyelitis, diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus, hepatitis B, two doses of MMR (measles, mumps, rubella), and two varicella (chicken pox) immunizations (or proof that they have had the disease) are required for all students.

PLEASE NOTE: proof of immunization is required before attendance is allowed.

- 4. Current physical examination and visual examination documentation (within six months) is required for kindergartners, seventh graders, and students enrolling from out of state.
- 5. For foster children or wards of the state or court, court documents and pertinent school records are required.
- 6. School records from previous schools (all grade levels).

Elementary schools south of Dodge Street - 12:00 - 6:00 Middle schools south of Dodge Street - 10:00 - 7:00


FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL SCHEDULE TUESDAY, AUGUST 14, 2018

High School, Grades 9-12 Modified First Day 9th Grade: 8:10am - 11:45am 10th-12th Grade: 12pm - 3:20pm

Buses will run regular schedules for elementary and middle school students. High school bus routes will run on the regular schedule with an additional drop off when freshman are dismissed at 11:45 a.m. Students in grades 10-12 riding the bus need to make alternate arrangements to arrive at school by 12 p.m.
