Welcome Back!

Thank you for a great start to the 2017-2018 school year!! It was nice to see so many people show up for Back to School 101 and Open House. We hope your kids are enjoying and appreciating Grandview Middle School. Our current enrollment is: 6th - 221, 7th - 194, 8th - 193.

A couple of reminders:

- 1) Student Pick Up We appreciate everyone's patience during pick-up. You are all doing a great job!! It is never fun to wait in a line but once the line starts moving (around 3:25pm), it moves pretty fast. A couple of notes:
- If you arrive early for pick-up (before 3:20pm) and the front lane is full, we encourage parents to go to the back and wait, if at all possible. The goal is to try and eliminate traffic from backing up on 180th street. If you routinely arrive 10-15 minutes early, please consider using the back parking lot for pick up. We appreciate everyone's patience and understanding during the heavy pick-up/drop-off times.
- The lane in front of the school starts as 2-way traffic until you get past the entrance to the back parking lot. People who arrive early have been able to go around parked cars in order to get to the back parking lot. This seems to be working, just do so with caution in case someone is trying to exit. This practice appears to work before 3:20pm but absolutely will not work after 3:20pm once students are exiting the building and traffic starts to move.
- Be extra careful at all the intersections. The intersection at 180th & Grand Ave. is very dangerous during heavy traffic. We do have a staff member at the intersection that leads to the back parking lot. Our staff are not trained in traffic control and are simply trying to facilitate the flow as much as possible. Please be careful.
- Set aside time for homework get in the routine of establishing clear guidelines and expectations at home regarding homework time. This may be one of the most important things to set up with your child when a new school year starts.
- 3) Visit the district webpage for all the lunch rules and regulations. You may contact the Sodexo Food Service company directly at 402-289-0443. Their main office is at Elkhorn High School. Students are **NOT** allowed to charge a meal if they already have a negative balance.

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6th Grade News

Reading

In reading, students are studying elements of fiction, including character development, setting, theme, and plot stages. They are also required to read their AR book complete their AR Reading Log as homework (always due on Monday). Their AR point goal for first quarter is due on October 9th. We are also studying Greek and Latin roots, prefixes, and suffixes. Please ask your student about their vocabulary words and encourage them to use the roots we're learning in words at home as practice. We're off to a great start!

Social Studies

Social studies classes will

begin a unit on the U. S. Government. Students will study citizenship and the three branches of federal government as laid out by the Constitution. Students will then study the three levels of government and each level's responsibilities.

Science

In Science, student are studying the Scientific Inquiry. They are learning about how to use the Scientific Method.

Language Arts

Language Arts students are currently working on a unit dealing with nouns and verbs, subjects, predicates, and sentences. They will then move on to writing quality paragraphs and the six

traits of writing.

Math 6

Students will start by working with graphs and learning about mean, median, mode, and range. The unit will end with students figuring out "The Average Sixth Grader".

Pre-Concepts

Pre-Concepts students will begin the year working on graphing and using measures of central tendency. Students will make line plots, histograms, and box and whisker plots. This unit will end with students gathering their own data and using that data to make graphs.



6th Grade Health

Mr. Zeplin

The students have been expressing what it is like to be an adolescent along with their interests and activities at the Middle School. This past week they were learning the major muscles of the body and how they apply to the Health Triangle. We have also started discussing trends and fads and how our likes and interests as well as bodies can change drastically and sometimes not much at all! The student's physical, mental/emotional, and social health have been a focus as we are learning the curriculum.



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7th Grade News

In World History, Mr. Bluhm & Mr. Feickert will start out the year by teaching students about early civilizations and why they began to settle in different locations.

In 7th grade Language Arts, Mrs. Hansen & Ms. Jussel have been reviewing the 6-Traits of Writing. We will now be applying what we know about the traits to our first piece of writing, a narrative essay.

Mrs. Pilkington & Mrs. Harger will work with Math 7 students on ratios and proportional relationships as well as percentages. Pre-Algebra students will be studying the

different tools they will use as they study algebra. Students can expect to have Math homework almost daily with quizzes given after every three to five lessons. We will begin ALEKS homework assignments in September.

In Science, Mrs. Bodyfield & Mr. Kush will begin the year by having students learn and practice inquiry skills they will need to be successful in Science. These include problemsolving, following directions, making observations, using the metric system, and working in groups. We will then be moving into our first textbook unit, Earth's Structure.



For Reading, Mrs. Kudrna & Ms. Jussel will start the school year with a focus on genres and vocabulary. After genre, we will move into the elements of fiction (textbook units #1-4) for the remainder of 1st quarter. Reminder that vocabulary units are only completed during 5-day weeks.

AR is in full swing! Students are taking AR quizzes; please contact individual teacher for specific comments/questions about AR. First quarter goal is due October 6th.

We would like to take this opportunity to lay the groundwork for a successful year. Please review the student handbook with your child and become familiar with it, paying particular attention to the following areas:

Grades from the Middle School will become a part of the students' permanent records and will help to determine classes for which they will be eligible in Senior High. Homework is expected to be handed in when it is due.

Please check the supply list that was included in the 8th grade Policies and Procedures handout at the beginning of the year. It is essential for the students to have these supplies for progress to be made. Please also discuss and follow the dress code.

Regular attendance is necessary for success. If you anticipate a lengthy absence, please contact the office and teachers in advance for upcoming assignments. Students who complete work prior to absences have an easier transition upon their return.

Throughout September you can look forward to the following units:

History – We will be reviewing the American Revolution and begin work towards our first common assessment over Duties and Responsibilities of American Citizens.

Language Arts – Students will be reviewing capitalization and punctuation rules in order to take their first DCA at the end September. They will also be working on sentence structure to prepare for text dependent analysis.

Pre-Algebra- Students will be reviewing operations with integers and applying that knowledge to the evaluation of algebraic expressions. We will begin our first unit of real numbers in our new consumable textbooks next!

Algebra - Students are solving and graphing linear equations and functions and will then begin working with slope. Reading - This month we will begin reading short stories, with a focus on elements of fiction. Each normal, five day week, your student should be studying for their Greek and Latin Roots test on Friday. In addition, each student should be reading at least 30 minutes every night to work towards their AR goal. The deadline is October 9th.

Science – Students will be reviewing the inquiry process and preparing for the district common assessment. They will then develop and test their own independent project. These will be completed at school.

Continue to monitor both PowerSchool, Moodle, and Google Classroom for up-to-date grade information and daily activities in the classroom. As always, encourage your child(ren) to come in for extra help before/after school and during study halls when we are available. We're off to a great start!

Welcome! – Welcome back to the third year of Elkhorn Grandview Middle School. We are so excited to be back and start another wonderful year of music making with your students. There will be three very familiar faces and one new face assisting us this year. Mrs. Dawn Sumrell (EGMS Band Assistant), Mr. Matt Rom (EHS Director of Bands) and Ms. Cassie Rathman (EHS Assistant Directors of Bands) will all be helping and assisting your students in numerous capacities this year. We are so fortunate to have so many friendly and able educators to help your students!! Welcome back!!!

Jazz Band – Our Grandview Jazz Band will hold auditions on Wednesdays, September 13, 20, and 27, beginning at 7:00 AM. This group is open to any and all 7th and 8th grade band students, regardless of instrument. Any interested students will be expected to attend all 3 audition dates. There will be some limits placed on nearly every section, but especially on rhythm section players (drum set, piano, bass, guitar). Interested students should be working in, or have already completed, the Tradition of Excellence Book 2 (or equivalent). The amount of time per day suggested will vary by the grade, but we strongly suggest a minimum of an hour a week for all students. 

Honor Choir for 7th and 8th graders


Heartland Festival Middle School Honor Choir at University of Nebraska Omaha is January 13, 2018.



REMINDERS FROM YOUR SCHOOL NURSE ...

If you haven't done so already, please get a copy of your required 7th grade physical and Tdap vaccine booster to the office as soon as possible.

We want to take great care of your child, and one way to help us do that is to provide the health office with current health information and medication needed for your child.

If your child has any health needs such as Asthma, Severe Allergy, Diabetes, Seizures, etc we must have an *action plan* on file that is signed by the doctor and the parent. This information is very important, so we know exactly what is best to do for your child, in the event of an emergency. Please remember if your student has any medications such as an inhaler, Epi-Pen, Benedryl, etc to be used in an emergency situation, we need to have those available at school, with a signed medication authorization, so trained staff can administer.

If your child requires **any** medication while at school, this includes all prescription and/or all over-the-counter (e.g. ibuprofen, acetaminophen, cough drops, etc) ALL MEDICATION requires a medication authorization, signed by the physician and the parent. All medication must be unexpired and provided in the original store packaging or pharmacy labeled container.

Self-carrying of inhalers in middle school and high school is allowed, but we still require the medication authorization and action plan to be on file in the health office. We also ask the parent and student to sign a self-carry form, acknowledging they will safely and appropriately carry and use their medication.
