STANDARDIZED TESTING

Students in grades 6th - 8th completed their MAP assessment earlier this fall. The MAP tests are closely aligned to the state tests (NeSa) that are administered in the spring. The NeSa tests are reported to the state department of education. The fall MAP results allow us to track student growth during the year and act as a predictor for student performance on the NeSa tests.

NeSa tests will be administered in late March-mid April to all grades. The second session of MAP will be given to 6th - 8th graders in early May.

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT

Elkhorn Grandview Middle School staff spent the September 18th In-service day working on school improvement initiatives. The morning was spent working in grade level/department meetings with EMS, ERMS, & EVVMS teachers reviewing student achievement data from last school year and setting student learning goals for this year.

POWER SCHOOL

If you did not attend Open House, you may still pick up your username and password information from the office. This will give you access to your child's grade book for each class. District policy states that parents/guardians must personally come in to the office to sign and pick up this confidential information. Unfortunately, we are not allowed to mail or send this information home with students. Please take advantage of this powerful tool.

APPOINTMENT REMINDER

Any student who needs to leave school during the day for an appointment **must check out with the office before leaving**. No student will be dismissed unless the following has occurred:

Parents/guardians have contacted the school office and arranged for the dismissal (by phone (402) 289-9399, e-mail to the attendance secretary at mlogelin@epsne.org, through the link on the EGMS webpage under Contact (Contact the Office) or sending a note with the student). You may notify the office up to a week before, but preferably no later than 8:30 am the day of the appointment. The student will be given a pass to leave the classroom, go to their locker, sign out in the office, and meet you at the front door at the requested time. **This process allows for minimal disruption to the classroom while allowing you to pick your child up as needed.** We appreciate your efforts to schedule appointments outside of school hours when possible.

DISTRICT SPELLING BEE

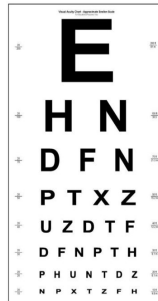

6th Grade News

Language Arts – This month, students will be finishing their first quarter common assessment on types of sentences, subjects, and predicates. We will then switch gears and begin a writing unit. 6th graders will begin working on their first practice Text Dependent Analysis. Students will also be working on the three main types of paragraphs.

Science – Science students will be finishing up a scientific inquiry unit. They will then begin working on ecology and living and non-living things.

Reading – Your child's AR goal is due Oct. 9th. Please

ask them frequently where they are on their goal and sign up for AR Home Connect to track their progress online. We will be taking the District Assessment on Main Idea and Supporting Details this month and then begin a unit on the novel Tuck Everlasting, by Natalie Babbitt.

Math 6 students will be working on their number sense. They will be solving problems using rates and ratios, and converting fractions, decimals, and percentages.

Pre-Concepts – In the next month, students will be work-

ing with fractions, decimals, and percentages and solving problems using percentages. Then our focus will shift to understanding integers and integer operations.

Social Studies students will focus on the United States Government. Students will study all three branches of the government: executive, legislative, and judicial. Students will also study the different levels of government: federal, state, and local. All students will take a First Quarter District Common Assessment (DCA) over the U.S. Government.

7th Grade News

In Science, 7th graders are continuing to work through the Scientific Inquiry unit and will then be moving on to the Inside Earth unit. In this unit, we will look at the structure of the Earth and how the surface of the Earth is changed by forces occurring below the surface.

In Language Arts, the month of October will be used to finish our common assessment over the Types and Kinds of Sentences. We will also explore fiction through a mystery unit. We will conclude the month by writing a ghost story.

7th grade Math students are working with Chapter 2: Percents. Students are learning to convert among fractions, decimals, and percents. We

have also found percent of a number, percent of change, sales tax, tips, and markups as well as discounts.

Pre-Algebra students are working in Chapter 1: Real numbers. We have learned about powers and exponents, how to multiply and divide monomials, negative exponents, and scientific notation. Students have also taken 2 number sense District Common Assessments so far this quarter.

In World History we are finishing up with the Fertile Crescent Empires. We have been looking at the ancient areas of Mesopotamia, Sumer, Babylon, and Assyria. In addition, we have been studying the different empires that were established in these areas

and how the civilizations and empires were developed. In the next chapter we will be studying Ancient Egypt.

In Reading class, we are starting our Elements of Fiction unit, which will continue through the end of December. October will also include our district common assessment over main idea and supporting details. Students will continue to complete vocabulary lessons on 5-day weeks; students will get the word list on Monday and quiz on Friday. First quarter AR goal is due Friday, October 6th. Please ask your child about his/her AR book; it helps with comprehension if they can communicate about the novel to someone else! Also don't forget to use the AR Home Connect to keep up with your child's progress on their AR goal.

8th Grade News

Our year is off to a fantastic start. We are enjoying your students. We will soon begin preparation for Student-Led Conferences which will be held October 17 & 18.

In Language Arts we will be continuing to fine tune our TDA skills in preparation for the text dependent analysis DCA in early November. We will also be finishing October with our first official essay.

In Reading the AR deadline is October 9th. Students will be continuing the quar-

ter's focus on comprehension and analysis of fiction and will take the common assessment over fiction the first week of November. Encourage your student to read each night for 30 minutes.

In American History we will be working toward our first common assessment, Duties and Responsibilities of American citizens.

In Science we will finish working on our science inquiry project and will begin our

Earth History unit.

Pre-Algebra students will continue working with real numbers including positive and negative powers and exponents, monomials, scientific notation, and roots. Algebra students will be solving and graphing linear equations using slope-intercept and point-slope form. Please encourage your child to continue to seek additional help before/after school whenever they need it!

SchoolMessenger – Are You Up to Date?

EPS uses a parent messaging system called SchoolMessenger to send emails and phone calls to parents. To ensure you are receiving important messages from your school, be sure to let the office know of any changes to your email addresses or phone numbers.

YouTube – A Guide to Understanding Your Child's Video Watching

YouTube is a common video watching platform used by many youths to find content on subjects that they find interesting or enjoyable to watch. In order to have a better understanding of what your child is watching on YouTube, below is a list of questions that you can ask:

What's trending today? Trending videos appear on YouTube's home page and show the most recent viral videos, what's funny, and what's being shared. Knowing what's trending will give parents a better understanding of the type of content your child is being exposed to by them simply going to the YouTube home page.

What channels do you subscribe to? If a child is taking the time to subscribe to a specific channel, it's a guarantee that the content being shown is something of interest to them. Get involved and find out what those channels are, so you can get a better idea of what specific content your child finds interesting and why. This could turn out to be a significant subject area interest for your child and a good common ground topic for conversations.

What's in your library? One's YouTube library is the place where videos that the user has liked or shared are stored. This too, is a way to discover content that your child finds interesting.

What was the last video you shared? Youth share things with others only when they find them to be interesting or enjoyable, or they feel that others will enjoy them as well. Get a glimpse into what videos are catching their attention by asking this question.

Purple Hands Rally



EGMS is celebrating its Purple Hands Rally Week starting Monday October 2nd .

This is an anti-bullying/tolerance program where students, parents, faculty, and community members pledge to stop bullying and violence in our school. There will be a play performed by RESPECT, entitled, "Teaming Up". This program explores how bullying escalates over time and how it can affect not only the targets, but the bystanders who see bullying in their school as well. It also explores the different types of bullying and how bullying back can often cause more problems than it solves. During the talk-back portion, students have the opportunity to practice techniques to stop and prevent bullying during a fun and safe role-play.

RESPECT is a research-based, nonprofit organization based in Omaha and was founded by child psychologist, Dr. Patricia Newman. In this program, actors interact with the students after the play to educate them in how to identify situations in which they may feel peer pressure and healthy strategies they may use if they feel pressure to engage in unhealthy behaviors. At times, these plays can bring out strong emotions.

Throughout the week, students will be asked to take the purple hands pledge, a pledge where students make a personal commitment to not use words or hands to hurt themselves or others. EGMS students will be participating in various activities throughout the week that promote the Purple Hands message. Please talk with your children throughout this week about what they are doing and take the pledge yourself.

"I will not use my hands or my words for hurting myself or others".

Red Ribbon Week: Students will be celebrating Red Ribbon Week October 23rd—October 27th. Red Ribbon week is aimed at bringing awareness to the community to educate youth and encourage participation in drug prevention activities. Student will be participating in activities aimed at just that.

8th Grade Only: Dillon's House and Coalition RX: Red Ribbon week will culminate with a powerful presentation (8th grade students only) from Dillon's House during Red Ribbon Week. This presentation tells the story of Dillon and how his life was taken by an unintentional prescription drug overdose. Since his death, Dillon's father and Dillon's former pre-school director, Carey Pomykata, have been working to inform kids and parents of our community about the realities of the misuse of prescription drugs among teenagers. This presentation is powerful and some students may be impacted more than others. Health screening time is coming!

On Thursday, November 2nd, we will be screening all students in 7th grade and any 6th/8th grade students who are new to Elkhorn Public Schools for: Height/Weight, Vision, Hearing, and Dental. If a potential issue is identified at the screening, an Elkhorn school nurse will rescreen, and a referral will be sent home at that time. A summary of your student's screening results will be sent home at the end of the school year.

Flu Vaccines

The CDC recommends getting a flu vaccine before flu begins spreading in your community. It takes about two weeks after vaccination for antibodies to develop in the body that protect against flu, so make plans to get vaccinated early in fall, before flu season begins. CDC recommends that people get a flu vaccine by the end of October, if possible. Getting vaccinated later, however, can still be beneficial and vaccination should continue to be offered throughout the flu season, even into January or later.

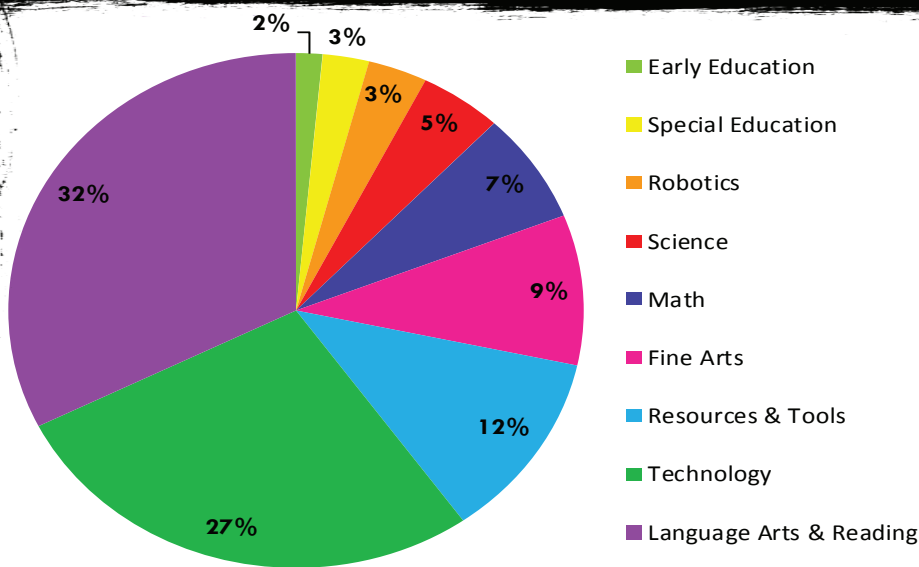
