ing on an algebra unit. They will learn how to simplify expressions and solve equations. Pre-Concepts students will be solving multi-step equations and inequalities.

> In Reading class, students will be studying sensory language, imagery, and style, followed by a non-fiction unit. Their AR Point Goal is due on March 12th.


Social Studies students will complete a unit on Personal Finance with a Budgeting Ac-

tivity and District Common Assessment over Personal Finance. Students will then begin studying banking and money.

Science students will be studying viruses, bacteria, and protists. These concepts will wrap up the third quarter.

In Language Arts, the students will be putting their efforts into a biography writing. Please be prepared to work with your child on the project. We will also be dipping our writing pens into the ink for text dependent analysis (TDA), which is our 3rd quarter common assessment.



In Science, 7th graders are continuing to work through the Human Biology and Health unit. In this unit, we discuss how the body is organized (cells, tissues, organs, and organ systems) and then discuss each of the body systems in detail. We will focus a lot of our discussion on the interdependence of these organ systems and what we can do to keep our bodies healthy.

In Language Arts we will begin a unit on persuasive writing. In February we will be researching and preparing for the "Living Legends" project, which will conclude with a debate. Each student will choose a living legend to research and write about and then will debate with their classmates to determine which living legend is the most legendary. In World History, we will be finishing the Middle Ages.~ We will be learning about social structures, knights, castles, etc. of Western Europe.~ The students really seem to enjoy learning about this time period, as many of them already know bits and pieces about the topics we study!

In reading, we are currently finishing our discussion of nonfiction text features and text structures in preparation for the District Common Assessment in early February. Next, we will be studying a science-fiction unit. AR goals for 3rd quarter are due on March 12th. Remember that they EGMS policy is that there will be a 10% penalty on a student's AR goal if the goal is not met until the following week. Math classes are in the middle of a unit that includes Linear Equations and Inequalities. We will have several guizzes throughout this unit prior to our end of the unit test. Pre-Algebra classes are in the middle of the Geometry unit, which includes the Pythagorean Theorem, lines, angles, area of twodimensional figures, and volume of three-dimensional figures. Students will take three district common assessments during this unit, and then will begin our unit on Probability.

SchoolMessenger Alerts

Both the EPS District and each individual building regularly use a parent messaging system called SchoolMessenger to send emails and phone calls to parents, including monthly information about building happenings, as well as school closings.

SchoolMessenger also allows recipients the option to "unsubscribe" from its mailing list; please understand that by "unsubscribing" you are completely removing your email address from ALL lists, including both District and building specific emails.

If you have previously unsubscribed and would like to begin receiving emails again, please let your building secretary know.

Elkhorn Public Schools Policy 507.13—Internet Safety Policy was written in compliance with the Children's Internet Protection Act. Tech Savvy Parent tips are intended to inform and educate parents of technology that may be available to their students. Tips may feature apps that are educational as well as those that may be a cause for concern to parents.

Parents of Current 7th & 8th Grade Students

In recent years we have heard from parents that students are spending more and more time at home doing school work with their family computers. As part of the EPS 5-Year Instructional Technology Plan approved by the school board in October 2016, next year's 8th grade students (current 7th grade students) will receive an individual Chromebook for educational use next fall. In addition, all high school students will also be receiving a Chromebook next fall. Therefore, current 8th grade students will receive an individual Chromebook for educational use when they transition to 9th grade. Please note, current 8th grade students will receive a different Chromebook than the one they used during the 17-18 school year.

The district is finding that much of our educational content requires access to technology, and Chromebooks allow us a cost-effective way to assure that students have this access when it is needed. As part of this initiative, parents of 2018-19 eighth and ninth grade students are encouraged to attend an orientation either during Back to School 101 or Open House in August. The exact dates for these orientations are not yet set, but the district wanted to begin communication with parents of current 7th-11th grade students. We are very excited about providing a computing device for these students next school year.


Parents are encouraged to discuss the 9th grade course recommendations and elective courses with their 8th grader before March 5th.
