2018 Standardized Achievement Testing at EGMS

Students at EGMS will have an important stretch of standardized testing beginning April 3. ALL students will be taking the state reading test (NSCAS-R) and state math test (NSCAS-M). Eighth graders will also be taking the state science test (NSCAS-S). The following is a summary of the testing schedule:

April 2 - April 6: ALL students at EGMS will take the state reading test (NSCAS-R).

April 9 - April 13: ALL students at EGMS will be taking the state math test (NSCAS-M).

April 16 - April 19: 8th grade students will take the state science test (NSCAS-S).

April 30 - May 11: ALL students will take MAP. This is the second administration of the MAP test this year and will show the growth of each student from fall to spring. MAP will assess students in the area of reading, math, language, and science.

These are all very important assessments that truly allow us to measure the academic growth of each student. Please insist that your child is getting plenty of sleep and eating breakfast each morning. We would appreciate you not scheduling appointments for your students on these days. If you absolutely must take your child out of school please let us know well ahead of time so that we may avoid having to interrupt any classrooms during a test. 




Students Arriving to School

SPORTS PHYSICALS FOR 2018-2019

All 7th & 8th graders for the 2018-2019 school year who plan to participate in sports at EGMS along with any 6th grader who wishes to participate in running club will need a sports physical indicating that they are cleared without restriction. Please contact your health care provider to arrange for your child to get a Sports Physical for next year. Keep in mind that Sports Physicals for next school year must be dated after May 1, 2018. Language Arts students will be finishing up a unit on irregular verbs. A slide show presentation with research will also be on the list of things to complete. They will then be working on district assessment dealing with the use of mechanics.

Sixth grade math students will be solving equations, writing and graphing inequalities and working with functions. Students will then begin a unit on integers where they will graph, compare, order, find the absolute value and plot points on the coordinate plane.

Pre-Concepts students will be writing, graphing and solving inequalities. Students will then begin a unit on geometry where they will find the perimeter and area of parallelograms, triangles, trapezoids and circles. They will also find the surface area of rectangular and triangular prisms.

In reading class, we are studying character traits and figurative language in memoirs. We will begin a unit on informational texts in March. We will also take the District Assessment over Greek and Latin roots, prefixes, and suffixes in March. AR Point Goals are

due on March 12th.

Social studies students will study The Five Themes of Geography and practice using map skills. They will then begin a unit over Urban Geography and study the growth and development of the city of Omaha.

In science, sixth grade students will continue to explore the kingdoms of protists and fungi.



7th Grade News

In Science, 7th graders are just beginning the Motion and Forces unit. In this unit we talk about how to describe an object's position and how we can use a reference point to determine if an object is in motion. We also describe motion in terms of speed, velocity, and acceleration, in addition to looking at how balanced and unbalanced forces affect the motion of objects.

In 7th grade Language Arts we will finish 3rd quarter in a debate unit. Student will prepare speeches to defend the living legend of their choice. We will begin 4th quarter working with reading classes on a poetry unit. In Language Arts, the unit will be focused on writing original poems and writing literary analysis of published works.

Seventh grade math classes will be completing a geometry unit in finding area and perimeter of two-dimensional shapes. Next, we will be starting our study of probability. We are also preparing for our NSCAS-M tests which will begin in April. Pre-Algebra classes will be finishing a unit with probability. Algebra classes are also preparing for NSCAS-M tests.

In World History the kids have just finished up the Middle Ages. It was a chapter the kids really enjoyed. We will now be moving into the Renaissance and Reformation.

In Reading, we are reading "A Wrinkle in Time" which we will finish by Spring Break. A movie based on this book will be released March 9th. AR for 3rd quarter is due Monday,

7th Grade Health - Human Growth & Development

Mr. Zeplin

As part of our middle school curriculum, your student has been enrolled in 7th grade Human Growth and Development during his/her 5th or 6th rotation of exploratory classes. Students beginning health during the 5th rotation, will be bringing an informational letter home on the first day of class, February 21st which will need to be signed and returned by February 27th. In advance, we appreciate your timely response on this.

As part of this course, we will focus on a wide range of topics relating to human growth and development. Topics will include: making healthy choices, self-respect, puberty/adolescence, human repro-

duction, pregnancy, prenatal development/childbirth, bullying/cyber-bullying, media influences, relationship skills, diversity in relationships, dating/healthy relationships, sexual harassment, abuse and sexually transmitted diseases.

Students will use the text Glencoe Teen: Healthy Relationships and Sexuality (2014). This text will provide a factual overview of human growth and development. Parents may contact us with questions or to preview the text (Elkhorn Public Schools policy 606.01).

We know that our students and their families have a range of beliefs, cultures and customs. Those family values are core, essential guidelines for your student. Parents/guardians will be asked to help guide conversations with their students throughout this rotation. We will send home four take-home assignments; topics include: What was it like when you were a teen?, Dating, Your child's arrival to your home, and Beliefs/Sexuality. The intent of these assignments is to foster family discussion and no written report is required.

Below is information about upcoming events, potential opportunities, and resources available for Elkhorn Grandview families.

Meet Yukon! (EGMS Therapy Dog)

Yukon is Mrs. Sumrell's (EGMS Band Teacher Assistant) own dog and serves as a support to EGMS students. Yukon was found running as a stray in Houston, TX and picked up by animal control there. He was 30 pounds underweight, heartworm positive, and very sick. He would not eat at the shelter and was labeled "failure to thrive". Taysia Blue Siberian Husky Rescue here in Omaha paid to have him driven up here to Omaha. He was approximately 4 years old at the time. Mrs. Sumrell's family fostered Yukon and helped him through the very difficult and painful heartworm treatments. They eventually adopted him. When Yukon had gained weight, was healthy, and heartworm free, Mrs. Sumrell took him to a basic obedience class at the humane society. He passed with flying colors and went on to take and pass his Canine Good Citizen class and get his CGC certificate. Yukon later attended "Love on a Leash" sessions where he had to pass ten supervised visits with three different supervisors in a variety of situations. He became a certified therapy dog in January of 2017. Since then, he has spent time at the Children's Respite Care Center, various retirement homes and is proud to call himself Elkhorn Grandview's Therapy dog. Yukon is a male malamute, approximately 8 years old, his favorite things are kids and belly rubs!

Yukon is at EGMS about an hour each week. If your child is struggling with something and you think some time with Yukon could be beneficial, please reach out to EGMS school counselor (Mr. Peterson).

TECH SAVVY PARENT TIPS

Elkhorn Public Schools Policy 507.13—Internet Safety Policy was written in compliance with the Children's Internet Protection Act. Tech Savvy Parent tips are intended to inform and educate parents of technology that may be available to their students. Tips may feature apps that are educational as well as those that may be a cause for concern to parents.

'Cookies' and Targeted Advertising

The ads you see when you search the web aren't by chance—your browser is using your cookies, or bits of data sent from the websites you visit, to collect and store data about you. Websites also track your search history, purchase history and profile information you provide to send targeted advertising as you browse the web. It is important to periodically clear your cookies, cache and search history from your browser to ensure your device is running as fast and secure as possible.

Time Savers

For students, procrastination generally takes on the form of "multitasking", which often leads to distractions and wasted time. In order to curb this occurrence prior to it becoming a bad habit that will move with them into adulthood, take a look at a few options for apps and plug-ins that help reduce the instances of this current trend.

<u>RescueTime</u>: this plug-in tracks how much time is being spent on specific sites and generates reports showing the results. By reviewing these reports, you and your child can see exactly where the majority of their time is being wasted.

<u>Work Mode</u>: Work Mode blocks access to all social media feeds during any time frame that the plug-in is turned on. What better way to ensure your child is focused solely on the task at hand than by making the distractions they typically default to inaccessible during the time they need to be focusing on other important things.
