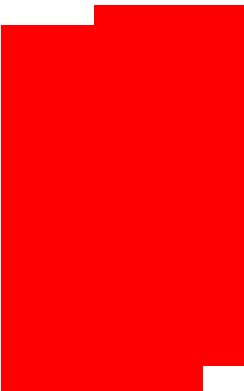
Electronic Devices Policy

Math 6 students will be working on an algebra unit. They will learn how to simplify expressions and solve equations. Pre-Concepts students will be solving equations and inequalities, then move into geometry.

In reading class, students will be analyzing historical fiction and nonfiction. Their AR Point Goal is due on March 16th.

Social Studies students will complete a unit on Personal Finance. Students will then take their 3rd Quarter DCA over Budgeting.

Science students will be wrapping up the study of human body systems. We will follow up with human growth and development.

In Language Arts, students will be focusing on the use of

conjunctions and capital letters. We will also be dipping our writing pens into the ink for text dependent analysis (TDA), which is our 3rd quarter common assessment.

In Science, 7th graders are continuing to work through the Earth Science portion of the year. We are finishing up our discussion of Earth's systems and resources and then will spend some time looking at how plate movement changes the Earth. Students will also focus on natural hazards and brainstorm ways to mitigate the damage done by these events.

In Language Arts we will begin a unit on persuasive writing. In February we will be researching and preparing for the "Living Legends" project, which will conclude with a debate. Each student will choose a living legend to research and write about and then will debate with their classmates to determine which living legend is the most legendary.

In World History, we will be finishing the Middle Ages.~ We will be learning about social structures, knights, castles, etc. of Western Europe.~ The students really seem to enjoy learning about this time period, as many of them already know bits and pieces about the topics we study!

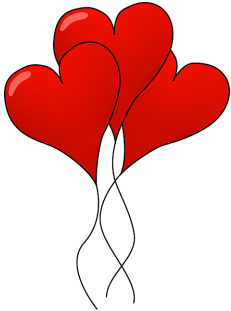
In reading, we are currently finishing our discussion of nonfiction text features and text structures in preparation for the District Common Assessment in early February. Next, we will be studying a science-fiction unit. **AR goals for 3rd quarter are due on March 16th. Remember that they EGMS policy is that there will be a 10% penalty on a student's AR goal if the goal is not met until the following week.**

Math classes are in the middle of a unit that includes proportions and percents. We will have several quizzes throughout this unit prior to our end of the unit test. Pre-Algebra classes are in the middle of the Geometry unit, which includes the Pythagorean Theorem, lines, angles, area of two-dimensional figures, and volume of three-dimensional figures. Students will take a district common assessments at the end of the geometry unit and then will begin our unit on Probability.

Important Registration Information from Elkhorn High School Counselors

Thursday, February 27th, 2020

Current list of 9th grade selected classes will be given to all Middle School Students

High school counselors went to the middle schools to distribute 9th grade registration materials in September. It was done much earlier this year in order to prepare for the opening of a third high school. Students received a copy of their registration sheet outlining courses offered to prospective ninth graders and specific course recommendations. Recommendations were based upon advice from high school administration, teachers, counselors, and test scores. Students selected what classes they would like for their electives, and then met one on one with a counselor to discuss their choices. **The list of classes that students are currently registered for will be sent home on Thursday, February 27th, with the opportunity for electives to be changed.** Students will also receive a copy of the curriculum guide. This guide includes information on curriculum, academic planning, and activities. Additionally, students will receive contracts that explain summer PE and summer Personal Finance online options.

Parents are encouraged to discuss the 9th grade course recommendations and elective courses with their 8th grader before March 4th.
