

From the Principal..... Dan Radicia

Dear Parents:

Important Dates: Wednesday, November 27, 2019 is 2:20 early dismissal time for Thanksgiving Break. Nov. 28, 29- No School, Thanksgiving Break.

It is November and we still have plenty of school left before the end of the first semester. Keep supporting your students to practice good academic habits which will help them finish strong in December.

Elkhorn High School successfully completed its first quarter of academics and activities for the 2019-20 school year and we are beginning the third week of the 2nd quarter. The counselors and administration will be checking our students grades with a mid-quarter grade progress report during the fourth week of the quarter and talking with students who are struggling academically. We will continue to serve our students with many opportunities that will help them become the adults they aspire to be. A well-rounded educational experience that focuses on academic rigor will assist our students as they navigate through many difficult decisions regarding future course study in high school, college planning, post-secondary institutions, and work place opportunities.

EHS Hosts an Internal District School Improvement Visit

Elkhorn High School's School Improvement team met with school district personnel to discuss our plan to increase the percentage of students meeting ACT Benchmarks (standards) in all four subject categories measured in the ACT, which is a predictor of college freshman level success.

We are interested in long-term trend data because comparing different cohorts in back to back years may seem plausible on the surface, it does not give us the performance growth data from 9-12th grade testing. We are looking at our PreACT 9 and PreACT 10 scores as a predictor of ACT 11 scores and analyzing three years of the same cohort data is more valuable than comparing last year's class to this year's class. We are in the growth business because we are in the Learning Business. The School Improvement Team presented our 3 year data on standardized testing scores and have implemented plans to help our most struggling students meet ACT Benchmarks. The 90 minute presentation allowed our team to discuss our curriculum pacing work which guarantees a viable, rigors curriculum for ALL learners. The Instructional Model that provides a framework for lesson design and our ongoing assessment of our intervention systems. We will continue our work of increasing our percentage of students who met the ACT Benchmark and look forward to our external visit in March.

Some Thoughts on the Value of Homework

The positive aspect of homework is that it can be used to reinforce learning at school. Homework provides students with time to reinforce learning and then apply it on their own. Once students have experienced an instruction, they should be expected to apply their knowledge independently. Homework can have an overall positive effect on a student's level of achievement, improvement in educational skills, and social skills when structured properly (Haas, 2008).

Today's learners will not only need critical thinking problem solving skills, but perseverance over a long period of time-GRIT. The ability to FOCUS and be conscientious about a task is why homework should be valued and encouraged at home to complete. Think about your student's study habits and if they are not desirable, what can be different? Sometimes our students study in their bedroom with the distractions of cell phones and music. A twenty minute assignment turns into an hour because of off task behaviors that caused our students to spend more time in inactive study periods which may result in losing valuable sleeping time and an incorrect accounting on how long they actually spend studying a night.

**Preparing for the Future: Student meetings with counselors about high school and beyond.**

The counselors have scheduled time with each senior to discuss college and career plans and to make sure they are making progress towards the graduation criteria. The Juniors meet with counselors to discuss 4 year plans, college searches, Naviance, ACT testing, career interests surveys, and the April 7 Nebraska State ACT test.

The Personal Finance course, which is a graduation requirement, has students complete the "Do What You Are" career survey which helps students with a career focus that would help them prepare for their 4 year high school plan. The counselors will discuss college and career leading pathways along with providing course summaries for students interested in our elective classes and sequence. The counselors encourage our students to think about maintaining a rigorous transcript so at the end of the 4 years, the student will be college ready.

In the middle of January, the counselors will reengage our students to discuss next year's course offerings and Pre ACT testing in April. Our counseling department has a robust plan to meet the college and career needs of our students as they matriculate from 9th to 12th grade.

Vaping and Teenagers: Important Information

Last year, I sent out information about Vaping and it continues to be a national story regarding its harmful effects. Elkhorn High School is similar to many other schools in the area which continues to deal with incidents involving student vaping. The purpose of this communication, is to inform you of the issue, give you resources if you feel your student is involved in this kind of behavior, as well as alert you to repercussions if your child engages in vaping on school property. We take this issue seriously due to the negative health effects vaping can have on our students. Vaporizers/e-cigarettes come in all different shapes. Some common styles we see look like a thick pen, a stylus for an iPad, a flash drive, or a small flask with a round chimney coming off the top. Some of the devices are very small and can easily be hidden on a person or blend in with normal backpack items.

The nicotine juices for these items are often fruit flavored. When used, the device produces a quick to dissipate vapor that does not smell smoky, rather a burst of strong, sweet or fruity scents. Like cigarettes, stores cannot sell vaping items to people under the age of 18; however, students report that they purchase the devices online or buy from older siblings, friends, etc.

Elkhorn Public Schools student discipline code treats e-cigs, vapes, and juuls in the same vein as tobacco products. Possession or use of tobacco, nicotine, or vapor products such as e-cigarettes or look-alike tobacco products, in any form, by students is prohibited on school property or premises or at school activities.

Consequences for possession or use are as follows:

First violation – two After Hours sessions

Second violation – two day Out of School Suspension

Third violation – five day Out of School Suspension with the possible recommendation of expulsion.

The Surgeon General reports that nicotine is addictive and can harm brain development, which continues until about age 25. We know that using nicotine may make it harder for school-related tasks such as learning and concentration. In conversations with students, it appears that many are not aware of the harmful effects of vaping.

If you feel your child has already developed an addiction to nicotine, we suggest you reach out to your health care provider. Another resource for parents to utilize is our contracted licensed mental health/chemical dependency counselors. Arbor Family Counseling (402-330-0960) is a wealth of information and support for families and due to the contract with the Elkhorn Public Schools, the initial consultation and follow-up visit are no charge to EPS families.

Thursday, December 19th and Friday, December 20th are Final Examination Days at EHS

In order to protect the integrity of the exams which are aligned across departments in both high schools, no finals will be proctored before the assigned times. Please make every attempt to ensure that your student is present for finals week to fully prepare and achieve at the highest levels. Please contact the administration in the extreme case that your student will not be in school for finals. Please note that these are full days with no early dismissal times. Students will have preparatory time built into this two day adjusted schedule, but please also communicate with your student the importance of being prepared for the cumulative final exams. Students may not be called out during finals periods, even if they are finished with their exam. Students are expected to be at school all seven periods both finals days. Please encourage your student to utilize study periods on finals days and help us curb students signing out during these periods. In most cases, student who miss finals will have to make up finals on Friday Jan. 3, 2020, during the staff in-service. Students return from winter break on Monday, Jan. 6, 2020.

SENIORS: Start thinking about EPS Foundation Scholarships

Students will apply for scholarships online! Students will have access to the scholarship applications on December 2nd. Descriptions of scholarships and information about how many letters of recommendation each require are available on the website now.

Visit their website (www.elkhornfoundation.org) and read through the scholarship descriptions to get an idea for which scholarships you want to apply for. You should start thinking about who you would like to have write you a recommendation if one is required to give that person plenty of time to have it ready to go. You will need to provide the recommender's name and email on the application. Once you submit all of your applications, the recommender will receive an email with a URL where they can put their recommendation.

The deadline for scholarship applications to be submitted is January 31st.

College Entrance Testing Information: Juniors

The ACT serves as Nebraska's standardized assessment for all public schools. This means that all juniors will be taking the ACT during the school day on April 7th, 2020. This is at no cost to the student and the registration of the test will be completed during the school day. Details regarding schedules that day will be released at a later date.

Most students take the ACT at least twice -- once junior year and once senior year. If you would like to take the ACT a second time in the spring of junior year or summer before senior year, here are the National ACT test dates for Spring and Summer of 2020:

Feb. 8, April 4, June 13, and July 18

Students register online at www.actstudent.org. Registration deadlines are approximately one month prior to the test date and are found at ACT's website.

Important note about score reporting: It is the student's responsibility to submit test scores to their college of choice. Upon registration for the test, students can select up to 4 colleges to receive their test scores. To avoid paying to send your scores at a later date, please ensure that you have selected 4 colleges of your choice at the time of registration.

Note to Seniors about December ACT: For seniors interested in improving an ACT score for scholarship purposes, **the December ACT is the last date to do this.** November 8th is the deadline to register for the December 14th ACT.

Dear Parents/Guardians of EHS students,
Last May, and again this October, I sent letters requesting forms to be filled out and returned that pertain to certain medical conditions:

Asthma Update, Action Plan (from Doctor), and Self-carry Consent Form (if student carries an inhaler at school), Seizure Updates, Severe Allergy Update, Action Plan (from Doctor), and Self-carry Consent Form (if student carries an EpiPen at school), and Diabetic Emergency Action Plan with Self-Managed Consent form.

If you have received these letters please fill out and return any forms as requested. If your child no longer has the listed condition, please sign and return the bottom portion of the letter you received stating they no longer have the condition, sign/date, and return to EHS.

Hard copies of all forms are always available in the health office.

We want to keep our students happy and healthy while at school. Returning action plans and updates help staff know what to do with your child should a medical emergency arise while they are at school.

District Reminders

SCHOOL MESSENGER - ARE YOU UP TO DATE?

EPS uses a parent messaging system called SchoolMessenger to send emails and phone calls to parents, including information about school and activities cancellations. To ensure you are receiving important messages from your school and the District, please let the office know of any changes to your email addresses or phone numbers.

TECH SAVVY PARENT TIPS - SOCIAL MEDIA RED FLAGS TO LOOK FOR

As the use of social media continues to be more frequent in adolescents, adults must remain continually vigilant in monitoring to ensure proper use of social platforms for the safety of youth.

When monitoring the social media use of a young adult, there are a few things to be on the lookout for and ways to combat them:

- 1) *Age-inappropriate content:* when using apps that feature user-generated content, users do not need to actually follow users posting explicit content in order to view it. To combat this occurrence, adults should explore the app themselves and attempt to determine how easily the information can be accessed prior to giving youth permission to use the app.
- 2) *Location Tracking and Sharing:* Apps such as Twitter, Snapchat, and Instagram have the option of allowing users to turn on their location sharing settings, making a user's location information available to others. Adults should assist in the setup of new social media apps for youth use and ensure location sharing settings are turned off in the settings to avoid sharing location information with individuals that should not have access to it.
- 3) *Anonymity:* While being anonymous doesn't always lead to cyberbullying, it certainly gives a sense of "security" to those seeking to cause harm. Apps such as Whisper and YOLO should be carefully monitored to ensure your student is neither being bullied or participating in the bullying of others.

Any photos turned in AFTER November 6, may not be included in the yearbook, but we will take a photo ourselves. Our goal is to NOT use any Lifetouch photos. We want each photo to look special. Let us know, and we can even have staff members do a photo shoot.
