## EHS Graduation Requirements Additional Requirements for College Admissions

- 8 semesters English
- 6 semesters Science (Colleges recommend 8)
- 6 semesters Mathematics (Many colleges require 8)
- 6 semesters of Social Studies (Colleges recommend 8)
- 1 semester Personal Finance and Careers
- 2 semesters of Physical Education
- 13 semesters Electives (Many colleges require 2 years of foreign language)

Some colleges require other coursework

## World Language



- Most colleges require 2 years of the same foreign language for college admissions.
- Some college majors require 4 years of the same foreign language.

For example: UNL Students in the following colleges/majors are REQUIRED to complete a foreign language sequence beyond the 2 years required in high school as part of their degree:

- College of Arts & Sciences (all majors)
  - Ie: English, Foreign Languages, History, Economics, Political Science, Psychology, Sociology, Actuarial Science, Biochem, Chemistry, Math, Meteorology, Microbiology, Physics, Environmental studies, Ethnic and Global studies, Aerospace studies, LGBTQ studies, and Racial justice
- College of Journalism and Mass Communications (all majors)
  - Advertising, Broadcasting, Journalism, Sports Media & Communication
- Hixson-Lied College of Fine & Performing Arts
  - (Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Music degrees)
- College of Business
  - (International Business majors)
- A student who has completed four years of the same foreign language in high school is exempt from taking foreign language in college. (Saving time and money)
- If you only have two years of the same foreign language, you may have to take a placement test which could take you back to Level I.
- AP World Language can provide you with college credit if you take the exam.

## **Summer Options:**

### Summer IT Fundamentals Online\*

(IT Fundamentals is one class that meets the technology graduation requirement—can also be taken during the school year.)
