Many important things are scheduled during the month of April – the most important being state testing. A testing schedule is included below and we ask for parents' continued support in avoiding test days for appointments or vacations. We know our students are prepared for these tests and will perform very well!

As we enter the 4th quarter, we at EMS will maintain high expectations and an academic focus. We would ask that you continue to check your child's progress on a regular basis and contact the school if you have any questions. We will work hard to keep students motivated and engaged. You can help us maximize learning by continuing to talk to your child about school and your expectations for them – all the way to the end of the year.

TESTING SCHEDULE

April and May will be busy months for assessments for Elkhorn students. All students at EMS will be taking state tests (NSCAS—formerly known as NeSA) as well as a final administration of MAP tests for this year. Our testing schedule is as follows:

April 2-6: NSCAS-ELA

April 9-13: NSCAS-M

April 16-19: NSCAS-S (8th only)

Apr 30 – May 11: Spring MAP

Please make sure your student(s) are getting plenty of sleep and eating a good breakfast on testing days. **If you can avoid having your student miss school during these days, it would be much appreciated.** If you have questions regarding the testing schedule for your child, please contact the office at 289-2428.

Dress Code Reminder

The Middle School dress code has been one of common sense, parental approval, and personal pride. Like behavior, an individual's dress should reflect sensitivity and respect for themselves and others. The following directions governing dress and personal grooming seek to encourage the student to take pride in his/her appearance, and to aid the student in developing the habit of good taste in personal appearance.



The following clothing or types of dress are PROHIBITED:

- 1. Dress which causes or has the potential to cause either a substantial disruption or material interference with the educational process.
- 2. Clothing which is too short, too tight, too revealing, or is inappropriate for school.
- 3. Dress which contains vulgar or offensive words or symbols or is sexually explicit, indecent, or lewd. Dress which reflects lack of sensitivity or respect for others is unacceptable.
- 4. Dress which promotes, advocates, or advances the use of alcohol, tobacco, or illegal drugs, including clothing which displays the logo or trademark of any brand(s) of alcohol, tobacco, or illegal drugs.
- 5. Sagging pants are not appropriate for school. Pants should be worn so that undergarments are not higher than the pants. The length of shirt worn to cover up the undergarments is not relevant.
- 6. Any gang-related symbol worn, written, carried, displayed, or communicated will not be tolerated (i.e., hats, caps, coats, sagging pants, bandannas, pagers, and/or handkerchiefs). Hats and sunglasses may be worn to school, but will not be worn in the halls or in any classes.
- 7. Any items which would detract from the educational environment will not be acceptable.

Dress code violations will be addressed with students by counselors or Administrators. Parents will be notified of a dress code infraction and be asked to supply the appropriate clothing for the student immediately. If parents/guardians cannot supply appropriate clothing, the student will be given clothing to wear that day from a friend or possibly from the lost and found.

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6TH GRADE NEWS

6th Graders are currently studying weather. When we are done with this unit the students will understand what drives the weather. They will know the layers of the atmosphere and which layer weather takes place in. They will understand how clouds are formed and they will be able to identify the different types of clouds and what they mean to a weather forecast. The students will know how humidity, air pressure and dew point affect weather.

Math 6 and Pre-Con students are doing final preparations for our state testing. The new state test is called NSCAS (Nebraska Student-Centered Assessment System). They will be competing in Math Madness and reviewing skills to help them be successful! NSCAS math testing will be April 9-13.

In reading, elements of nonfiction will be the focus of study. Students will need to continue with their daily reading and testing for Accelerated Reader. Final AR goal points for 4th quarter will be due on Friday, May 11th.

The Social Studies class will focus on the geography and urban geography on the remainder of the year. The city of Omaha will be studied according to its growth and formation.

In Language Arts, we are currently working on capitalization, commas, quotation marks, using the right word, and dialogue. Students will take a District Assessment over these skills in April.

7TH GRADE NEWS

In Science, we will continue the Motion and Forces unit, studying intro physics topics. We will be investigating gravity, friction, and laws of motions through hands on activities. Students will review scientific method while investigating motion through an independent study. Our final unit of the year will be astronomy.

In reading, we are taking the NSCAS before doing a collaborative poetry unit with language arts. We will then move in to learning about mythology.

In World History, we will study the Renaissance and Reformation, Science and Exploration, the Enlightenment and Revolution and finish up the year studying the World Wars.

In Math, students are preparing to take the NSCAS, or formerly known as the NeSA test. Testing for students will occur April 9–13.



Spring is finally here! We are looking forward to an eventful month. We will be giving the NSCAS-ELA the week of April 2nd, the NSCAS Math test the week of April 9th, and the NSCAS Science will be given April 16-19. Please let your children know of the importance of these tests as they will help determine some of their high schools classes and activities. Attendance is crucial to the success of your student.

In Language Arts during the 4th quarter students will take their final District Common Assessment over writing and grammer skills. Please ask them if they are preparing and studying for this test in April. Our final writing unit will be the writing portfolio. This is a comprehensive writing project which will take place for the better part of the quarter.

In both Algebra and Pre-Algebra we will be preparing for and taking the NSCAS Math test.

In Science we are starting chemistry and learning about the properties of matter. Students will also be reviewing for NSCAS Science.

In Reading we will complete all 20 of our Vocabulary Units by the end of April. In the first two weeks of May, we will review for the Vocabulary DCA, our last DCA and last major test of the year. AR is due May 14, but your child will <u>have an opportunity to earn some of the goal through two in-class literature circles</u>. Please ask to see your child's bookmark.

In American History we will be studying the late 1800s and early 1900s Progressive Era.

TECH SAVVY PARENT TIPS— APRIL 2018

Elkhorn Public Schools Policy 507.13—Internet Safety Policy was written in compliance with the Children's Internet Protection Act. Tech Savvy Parent tips are intended to inform and educate parents of technology that may be available to their students. Tips may feature apps that are educational as well as those that may be a cause for concern to parents.

Parental Controls

Did you know you are able to limit your student's access to websites, email contacts or even control the time of day and the duration in which they use the computer? By creating different user profiles and customized parental controls on your home computer you can help make sure your child is viewing age-appropriate content.

Apps Parents Should Know—Snapchat and photo saving apps

Snapchat is an app that allows users to send pictures, videos and short captions to friends 10 times faster than (mms) text messaging. The app allows the sender to determine when the message will expire (up to 10 seconds). Users have the option to send a "snap" to one person or a group of people. Once a message is viewed, it will disappear and cannot be retrieved again. However, the person receiving the 'snap' has the ability to take a screenshot of the photo and save it directly to their device. It is important to understand that even though a message may expire, there is no guarantee a photo will not be re-distributed by the receiver. Several new apps have been created to quickly save Snapchat photos before they expire. Apps like MirrorGo (Android), ScreenRecorder (iOS), and Snap Saver save photos and videos without notifying the sender. Bottom line—never assume a Snapchat picture or video is temporary or private.
