- We do not allow students to bring book bags or other containers into school the last day. The only items allowed at school on May 25 will be a pen/pencil and a camera. (A cell phone with camera is acceptable.)



Lockers will be cleaned out and all supplies need to be taken home the last full day of school, Thursday, May 24th. Yearbook distribution will occur in the morning on the last day. Students will not receive their yearbook or their report card if they have any unpaid fines.

ONLINE REGISTRATION COMING FOR 2018-2019

The district is planning to move to an online process for registration next year. Instead of updating school information on paper and standing in lines at Back-to-School 101, we will be asking parents to update information electronically. In preparation for this, parents/guardians will need to make sure they can log into a current Powerschool account for their student. If you have not yet set up a Powerschool account, you will need to do so in order to access the online registration for next year. SPORTS PHYSICALS FOR 2018-2019 SPORTS (GRADES 8-12)

Physicals must be dated after May 1st, 2018 for your child to participate in sports activities for the 2018-2019 school year.

All 7th & 8th graders for the 2018-2019 school year who plan to participate in sports at EMS will need a sports physical. Please contact your health care provider to arrange for your child to get a Sports Physical for next year. Keep in mind that Sports Physicals for next school year must be dated after May 1, 2018. Most physician offices will get very busy in late summer so schedule your appointments early. Fall sports will begin the first week of school in mid August and students are not allowed to participate without having a Sports Physical turned in.

*****Reminder:** All 7th grade students are required to have a complete health examination by their health care provider. This will also cover their sports participation physical if they are planning to participate in any sports activities during the 2018-2019 school year.



LIBRARY NEWS

MS. HARTMAN

The library recently concluded our March Mystery Madness in the library activity, featuring our many mystery titles as well as some problem solving, collaboration and negotiation skills. The mystery activity included 11 teams and resembled the board game Clue. During the month of April, poem books and novels in verse were featured, as April is National Poetry Month.



Also during April the library provided space and Sphero robots for 7th grade Science students who were working on measuring, calculating and predicting results pertaining to speed, distance traveled, time and velocity. The following week, 8th grade Speech and Drama students sharpened their research and digital citizenship skills by practicing advanced, one box searches for credible debate resources.

Prior to the end of the school year, the library will again be working with reading teachers to provide summer reading suggestions. Take-home sheets with such titles as well as next year's Golden Sower nominated book list will be made available in the reading classrooms as well as in the library. Elkhorn is lucky to have a wonderful public library and the middle of May is a great time for kids to transition there for summer reading needs.

The EMS library also provides several hundred ebooks which will remain available for checkout during the summer months. Students may stop into the library anytime to get additional information regarding ebook accounts and the Destiny Discover app. An ebook tutorial is located on the Library Web Page located beneath the banner, under the How do I link.

6TH GRADE NEWS

In Reading class, elements of informational text will be the focus of study. Students will need to continue with their daily reading at home and testing here at school for Accelerated Reader. Final AR goal points for the 4th quarter will be due on Friday, May 11th.

In Science, we will finish up the year studying about wave and how they interact with and without matter. We will focus on the characteristics of sounds and light waves.

Social studies will begin learning about Urban Geography and will finish up the year by looking at the history of Omaha.

In Language Arts, students will soon wrap up their mechanics unit with our last district assessment. After that, they will be writing poetry. They will explore the ways different uses of figurative language, literary devices, and fonts influence the tone of a piece.

Math 6 will end the school year with our integer unit. In addition we will be doing real life math involving sales tax and percentage discounts. In Pre Con we wrap up the Geometry unit and end with real life math as well.

7TH GRADE NEWS

In Science, we are studying the Earth in the Solar System. In this unit we study the motion of objects in the solar system and the causes of seasons and phases. We will then study space travel and look at current and future missions. At the end of the semester there will be an end the year final for 7th grade, in which students will be able to use their science notebooks.

In Math 7, we will be studying scale factor, circle graphs and probability to the end of the year.

In Pre-Algebra, we will be introducing an algebra unit involving slopes, intercepts, and systems of equations.

In World History we are studying the Enlightenment and Revolution before moving into World War I and World War II.

In Reading, we will be reading The Transall Saga novel together in class. AR goals for the fourth quarter are due on Friday, May 18.

In Language Arts, we will finish our study of mechanics, usage, and grammar before moving into our final writing project for the year.

8TH GRADE NEWS

In Language Arts we are working on a writing portfolio project. Students will be searching themselves to discover who they really are and completing several writing pieces in that theme. This is a big project, and students will be expected to deliver a polished, creative final product.

In Science students will be finishing up our Properties of Matter unit.

In Mr. Hultman's Reading class we will be completing our final vocabulary work and preparing for the Vocabulary DCA, which also counts as 2 test grades in our Reading category. That test is scheduled for Tuesday and Wednesday, May 17-18. AR is due May 14, so please check bookmarks! In our Guided Reading we are reading the play "The Diary of Anne Frank: Diary of a Young Girl".

In American History we are finishing learning about the Progressive Era and preparing for our upcoming DCA.

In Pre-Algebra we will be studying linear graphing. In Algebra we will be finishing with radicals and rational equations.

~ Medication Pick-up ~

The school is not able to store medication over the summer. So please remember, all student medications must be picked up by a parent/guardian, from the health office by Thursday, May 24th, by 4:00 pm or it will be properly disposed of.

~ Medication for the 2018-2019 school year ~

If your student requires any medication (over-the-counter and/or prescription) while at school, each medication must have a Medication Authorization form signed by the parent and a physician, before we can administer. All medications must be unexpired and provided in the original packaging and/or pharmacy container. For prescription medication, please only provide a **maximum of 30 day supply** at a time.

Apps Parents Should Know—Apps that Encourage Outdoor Activity

With the end of the school year in sight, parents are beginning to think about new and exciting ways to keep students busy, without losing them to the constant temptation of mindless technology use. The following apps allow individuals to utilize their tech instruments, while also being recommended by Common Sense Media (www.commonsensemedia.org) for encouraging outdoor activities.

Plum's Photo Hunt: this free app, sponsored by PBS, is a great way to engage elementary-aged children and their parents in outdoor activity. Users are given a list of objects and observations that can be found in nature of which to take photos. Finding things like signs of animal life, tiny things in nature, and patterns found in nature gives children a sense of adventure while learning new exploratory skills and improving their observation skills.

Geocaching: Geocaching is a great family activity that inspires outdoor activity in conjunction with family time. The app gives users a list of GPS locations where others have stashed hidden treasures, and provides hints and directions on locating it. While geocaching is a great family activity, it is suggested that users always have adult supervision and is not recommended for individual use by children.

As the school year winds down, we would like parents to check the balance(s) on their student(s) lunch accounts. If an account is **negative**, ***please make a payment***. We ask that no account is left negative over the summer. Positive accounts will carry over to the next school year.

If you have a graduating Senior their account must be paid if it is negative, in order to be cleared and signed off on May 16, 2018. If there is a remaining balance, you can request a refund or balance transfer after May 18, 2017.

***Please be sure to cancel automatic payments to prevent additional deposits before requesting a refund.**

We ask that you pay close attention to your accounts and keep them funded to avoid your child missing a meal. There is be NO charging allowed at Secondary levels. When an account reaches \$0.00 the student will need to pay for meals in cash or have funds deposited to their account prior to receiving a meal.

Emails are sent on a daily basis for students under \$5.00 and at the end of each month regardless of the balance. Parents are encouraged to go online and set up their accounts to receive emails prior to going negative.

If you have not received an email from us, please contact your school to make sure they have a correct email address on file, or check your spam folder.

Lunch accounts can be set up and viewed through our District website at www.elkhornweb.org. Click on Login Links on top left corner, scroll down and click on Parent/Student then Lunch Account.

You will need to create an account, using your students pin number, birthdate and zip code to your student's school. Please set up your email reminders so that you receive an email prior to your student going negative by clicking the view/set reminder box.

You will need your student id numbers which are available at our office or from your student.
