Summertime Planning for Juniors:

Summer is the time to do some serious college planning. Here is your to-do list:

- 1. Narrow down your college choices to 3-6. Tour a few schools this summer. Visit educationquest.org and search Naviance (http://connection.naviance.com/elkhorn) for information about colleges that interest you.
- 2. Get involved in extracurricular activities and community service.
- 3. Update your Activities Resume on educationquest.org. Include extracurricular activities, honors, awards and jobs.
- 4. Identify teachers, coaches and counselors who will write letters of recommendation for you; you may need them for admission and scholarship applications.
- 5. Find a summer job to help pay for college expenses. Ask employers if they offer education assistance programs.
- 6. Consider taking the June 10 ACT (last chance to test until September). Practice tests available in the counseling center.

NHS). The application includes documenting activi-	
ties, awards, and service hours. Service hours must be	
verified with a signature of the person in charge of the	
event. We encourage students to collect signatures as

collect them later. You can either print the NHS appli-	
cation and collect signatures there or collect signatures	
on loose paper and submit these with your applica-	
tion. It's also a good idea to track activities and

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Looking to play sports in college?

Juniors interested in playing at a Division I or II college sport need to register with the NCAA Clearinghouse at www.eligibilitycenter.org. ACT scores need to be sent directly from ACT. Once registered, request a transcript from the counseling center. Many juniors request transcripts prior to leaving school for the summer. Students interested in NAIA schools must register at www.playnaia.org and request a transcript.

Twelve FCCLA (Family, Career, and Community Leaders of America) members represented Elkhorn South High at the Nebraska FCCLA Leadership Conference April 2-4, 2017 in Lincoln, NE. The chapter brought home a Gold Chapter Award for their solid Program of Work during the 2016-17 school year including criteria in four categories: Membership, Leadership, Promoting FCCLA, and Competitive Events/Programs.

In addition, the chapter was recognized with the Outstanding Nebraska National Program Award for their Leadership Service in Action Project. The chapter completed seven service projects during the year, but the project submitted for recognition was the Days for Girls project. Members met for six workdays after school and Saturdays to complete 34 personal hygiene kits for girls in developing countries. These kits enable girls to complete their educations and save an estimated 180 days of school that otherwise would have been missed. Members and adult volunteers logged 168 service hours working on the kits. This project was led by Kendalyn Bingham, Vice-President of Service.

Elkhorn South FCCLA had three competitive entries at SLC this year. Kendalyn Bingham and Delaney Craig earned a bronze medal for their Chapter Service Project Portfolio highlighting Days for Girls. Elena Renner earned a silver medal for her Food Innovations project. Elena was tasked with creating an after work-out snack that contained 10 grams of protein. After six production attempts and input from two focus groups, Elena developed the perfect Pumpkin Protein Muffin. Kelly Wong earned runner-up state champion and a gold medal for her Career Investigations Project and presentation. Kelly aspires to be an obstetrician-gynecologist. She skillfully outlined what it will take to become a doctor and assessed her skills and characteristics that match the occupation.

Kaylin Behrens and Lauren Paben participated in FCCLA Serves by helping with projects at the Lincoln Children's Zoo. Jillian Hunsinger and Bailey Scott served at the Matt Talbot Soup Kitchen. Annie Wang joined the tour at Sheldon Art Museum and Arbie Hodges toured with Hospitality in the Haymarket. Ashley Wyzinski attended the MADD Youth Ambassador Training. 

If you have a graduating Senior their account must be paid if it is negative, in order to be cleared and signed off on May 17, 2017. If there is a remaining balance, you can request a refund or balance transfer after May 19, 2017. *Please be sure to cancel automatic payments to prevent additional deposits before requesting a refund.

We ask that you pay close attention to your accounts and keep them funded to avoid your child missing a meal. There is be <u>NO charging allowed at Secondary levels</u>. When an account reaches \$0.00 the student will need to pay for meals in cash or have funds deposited to their account prior to receiving a meal.

Emails are sent on a daily basis for students at \$5.00 and below and at the end of each month regardless of the balance. Parents are encouraged to go online and set up their accounts to receive emails prior to going negative.
