ACT and Pre-ACT Testing Day

On Tuesday, April 2nd, all Juniors will take five sections of the ACT: English, Math, Reading, Science and Writing. Juniors will be dismissed at approximately 1:00pm. ESHS 9th and 10th Graders will take the pre-ACT on April 2nd which includes English, Math, Reading and Science tests. 9th and 10th grade students will be dismissed at approximately 12pm. No lunch will be served on April 2nd. Seniors will not in school on Tuesday, April 2nd.

Please do your best to plan vacations during Spring Break (March 15th-22nd). As we get closer to the ACT dates, I will send emails with full details. The administration and counselors work to ensure that loss of instructional time to all students is minimized during these assessments.

Dress and Appearance

As the calendar turns from a winter month to a spring month, please be mindful of your students’ attire at school. The high school dress code is truly based on common sense and social appropriateness. I have included the text here as a point of reference for you and your students. I appreciate the cooperation and conversations with your students.

Dress and Appearance - *The High School dress code has been one of common sense, parental approval, and personal pride. The impressions you make are important to yourself and your school. Therefore, the students at Elkhorn South High School shall wear appropriate clothing. Clothing is not to be too tight, too short, too ragged, too bare, or so extreme as to be immodest. If a student's appearance is such as to cause a spectacle, interrupts classroom activities, or embarrasses others, he/she will not be permitted to remain in school. Clothing with tobacco, alcohol or drug advertisements or any objectionable printing that suggests tobacco, drug, or alcohol use, are not to be worn to school...* (page 5, ESHS handbook).

Seniors: Scholarships and Financial Aid

Scholarship Information

Start collecting your scholarship award letters! In April, seniors will complete their Senior Exit information in Naviance. This asks for important information, including where to send the student's final transcript and verification of all scholarships to be printed in the graduation program. To let us know of scholarships, please make a copy of the award letter and return it to the counseling center. Please let us know of any and all offers so your student can be recognized – even if the offer may not be accepted by your student. The deadline to turn in scholarship offers to be printed in the Graduation Program is Friday, April 12.

FAFSA – March 15 is a recommended date to have the FAFSA done, though check with your college regarding their deadline. Apply online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. When applying online both student and parent need a PIN number to complete the electronic application. If you do not have a PIN, you can apply for one at www.pin.ed.gov before beginning the FAFSA. If you would like help, call 391-4033 to make an appointment at EducationQuest and they will help you for FREE. The website is www.educationquest.org. The website has great video tutorials.

Military Academies: Juniors interested in a military academy should begin the process junior year. Visit the website of your academy of choice for information.

Air Force Academy Summer Seminar: Juniors interested in the Air Force Academy's Summer Seminar program can get a complete explanation of the program and eligibility requirements online at www.academyadmissions.com. This is a highly competitive application process that gives students a week long opportunity to see what the Academy involves.

Summer Opportunities:

Many colleges offer summer opportunities for high school students. If you have a particular college of interest, visit their website.

AP Testing Information:

The registration deadline is March 1 at 3:30PM. These tests are optional but by earning a successful grade on the test the student can potentially earn college credit for the course.

College Entrance Testing: For Juniors

Upcoming test dates: All juniors will test on April 2 at ESHS and do not need to register. Additional ACT national test dates are: April 13, June 8, and July 13. Register at www.actstudent.org. Registration deadlines for national test dates are about one month prior to the test date. Full length practice tests available in the counseling center.

Important note about score reporting: Upon registration for the test, students can select up to 4 colleges/ organizations to receive their test scores. To avoid paying to send your scores at a later date, please ensure that you have selected 4 colleges of your choice at the time of registration. Sending your scores to colleges also opens the lines of communication between the college and your student, so we would encourage students to report their scores.



Tech Savvy Parent Tip: Device Usage Reports

Currently, both Apple and Android provide reporting features on the usage of a device in the form of Apple's "Screen Time" report and Google's "Digital Well-Being" report. Both options provide parents with an opportunity to better understand their child's device usage, from a broad report detailing the amount of time spent on the device, down to the number of minutes spent on a specific app. In addition, both platforms also allow the ability to limit time spent on specific apps, and the ability to create downtime by setting specific times of the day where the device is unable to be used for anything other than the specific requirements you put in place.




