From the High School Principal- Mark Kalvoda

As we move into the winter months, the students and staff of Elkhorn South eagerly anticipate the start of the second semester and the excitement that comes with it. The first semester has been full of opportunities, successes, and learning experiences. Our students have faced adversity and challenges, but have persevered. Second semester offers new challenges and new experiences, but also affords students a fresh start if needed.

At the conclusion of the 1st Quarter, ESHS proudly honored students for achieving 3.25 and above grade point averages. Of the 902 Honor Roll students, 363 achieved 4.0 GPA's for the first quarter. On November 7th, ESHS paused from the normal schedule to honor these high achieving students with the ESHS Honors Convocation. In addition to celebrating the Honor Roll students, ESHS teachers also nominated students for Elkhorn Excellence awards. 57 students were awarded Elkhorn Excellence Awards for showing extreme effort, exemplifying strong integrity, having first-class character or going out of their way to assist others…essentially Elkhorn Excellence awards are designed to honor those students who make ESHS a better place to be. As principal at ESHS, I am very proud of our students' efforts so far this year and enjoy taking a moment from the typical day to give them an Elkhorn South Excellence t-shirt and to personally thank them for their contributions to the culture of high expectations here at Elkhorn South. Special Thanks to ESHS Senior CJ Crouch for designing this year's Excellence Shirts.

In the winter months, it is common to see more student absences due to illnesses, family trips and the like. We speak frequently with our students about the importance of instructional time and generally see a dip in achievement from students who miss class time. Instructional time is paramount to student success and nearly impossible to replicate outside of the classroom. Please be thoughtful in planning family vacations and other extended absences from school. In the best interest of students' educational achievement, please plan vacations and family trips around the school calendar whenever possible and encourage your students to strive for perfect attendance. The average Elkhorn South student missed just over six days of school and we were proud to honor 21 students with perfect attendance for the entire 2018-19 school year. Please reflect upon your student's attendance in comparison to our averages here at ESHS.

In the event that your child misses school for a professional appointment, such as orthodontist, physician or the like, please provide the school with documentation of this appointment when your student returns to school. This proactive piece of record-keeping will serve invaluable if your student exceeds eight absences per semester. Thank you for your cooperation.

Elkhorn South will have finals week to conclude the first semester. Cumulative final exams are an integral part of assessing student learning and simulate the college finals experience. In order to protect the integrity of the exams which are aligned across departments in both high schools, **no finals will be proctored before the assigned times**. Please make every attempt to ensure that your student is present for finals week to fully prepare and achieve at the highest levels. Please contact the administration in the extreme case that your student will not be in school for finals.

Semester finals will be on Thursday, December 19th and Friday, December 20th. Students will take semester finals in periods 1,3,5 on Thursday and periods 2, 4, 6, 7 on Friday. Please note that these are full days with <u>no early dismissal times</u>. Students will have preparatory time built into this two day adjusted schedule, but please also communicate with your student the importance of being prepared for the cumulative final exams. Students may not be called out during finals periods, even if they are finished with their exam. Students are expected to be at school all seven periods both finals days. Please encourage your student to utilize study periods on finals days and help us curb students signing out during these periods. Thank you for your cooperation.

**Please Note- No School for students on Friday, January 3rd for teacher in-service day. Second semester begins Monday, January 6th.

Second Semester Drop/Add

Drop/Add for second semester will take place on December 16th & 17th. Second semester schedules are mailed in early December with specifics. Many courses are at capacity and there are limited choices for change. As a general rule, students cannot drop year-long classes. Contact your counselor if you have questions.

Junior College Entrance Testing

A common question from junior parents this time of year centers around when juniors should take the ACT. Most student test two to three times before they graduate. ACT will be administered to ALL juniors Tuesday, April 7th at ESHS.

For many juniors, the April 7th test may be the only time the student will take the ACT their junior year. Other juniors may likely consider a Saturday national test day. ACT offers Saturday tests dates February 8th, April 4th, June 13th, and July 18th.

For advice on what is most appropriate for your student, please contact your counselor. Register for Saturday test dates online at www.act.org. Registration deadlines are approximately one month prior to the test date and are found on ACT's website.

Score Reporting

It is the student's responsibility to submit test scores to their college of choice. During registration students can select up to 4 colleges to receive their test scores. To avoid paying to send score at a later date, be sure to select 4 colleges at the time of test registration. Colleges take the best score so it is to the student's benefit to send scores each time.

Test Prep Resources

Each student's Naviance account provides a large bank of pracitce ACT questions. Full length practice tests can be picked up in the counseling center. Also, visit elkhornweb.org/eshscounseling/testing/ for test preparation resources. Reach out to your counselor for questions.

Senior College Planning

College Applications

Ideally applications should be completed before winter break. Be sure to check deadlines! The counseling center is <u>CLOSED</u> over winter break. All transcript requests must be made prior to winter break for early January deadlines. Check if a separate application for scholarships is required. Call the college admissions office or see counselor for questions.

College Financial Aid Forms (FAFSA)

Colleges will use your FAFSA results to determine how much they will award in financial aid. FAFSA opened October 1st, which means senior families should be working on the paperwork <u>NOW</u>. To estimate FAFSA results, use the *College Estimator* at EducationQuest.org. EduactionQuest is a local, helpful, and FREE resource for college financial planning.



THE PARENT'S ROLE IN ATHLETICS- "What is appropriate parental support?"

News Article-"Tips for Parents"

Parents are vitally important in the development of their son's or daughter's athletic involvement. Their trust, support, counseling, and physical presence helps to create the support base student athletes need in order to compete both mentally and physically throughout the season. Parent support, appropriately utilized, is a strong booster of confidence for athletes, increases loyalty and enthusiasm for the athlete, and is a vital asset for any coach.

One of the most important support actions for parents is to encourage and assist players and coaches to help themselves when solving problems during the season. Parents should know problems can and do occur during the season and accept that aspect of competitive athletics. Throughout the season, parents must give total support to the coach and to the athletic program, just as athletes must give 100% of their loyalty to their program and coach. If problems do occur, parents should allow the athlete and the coach the opportunity to work through problems. If parents show disloyalty to the coach or to the program, they transmit the negative message to their children that the athletic program and/or the coach is now somehow incorrect, and immediately the athlete is placed in a situation where it becomes a right vs. wrong decision, and at a minimum, produces a "grey area" with many question marks.

We have all been placed in these situations, and sometimes it's tough to see your child fail. Most of us would agree, however, that in the long run, things normally work out for the best. Please help your student/athlete to make good decisions about problems and to correctly handle the many questions that arise during any sports season. Remember the phrase, "Alone we can do so little, together we can accomplish so much."

Thank you to our awesome health screen volunteers. We couldn't have done it without you! If your student had results that indicated a need for further evaluation, you should be receiving those referrals in the mail. Please return a copy of the completed referral, so I can update your student's health information. Thank you! As we head into the winter months, we see an increase in cold and flu symptoms. Please keep your child home if they have a fever of 100* or greater, vomiting/diarrhea, persistent cough, unknown rashes, pink eye, or in general not feeling well. This helps your child get well faster, and helps reduce the spread of germs.

Tech Savvy Parent Tips - Apps to Know

TikTok is a social media app that allows users to generate video content including singing, dancing, or simply talking, as well as interact with other user's content covering a wide variety of topics. Similar to other social media apps, TikTok accounts are created with a default privacy setting of Public, allowing any user to interact with the content posted, send private messages, and capture location information. To protect youth utilizing TikTok, a user account can be set to Private to allow only Friends to see and interact with posted content and Location Sharing may also be turned off completely.

TikTok focuses mainly on music, so there is a potential that youth utilizing the app will encounter age-inappropriate content. TikTok does attempt to prevent this by hosting a separate section for children that allows access only to clean, curated videos and disabling commenting, searching, or posting their own videos. However, due to the ability to circumvent the required process that enable the Children's section, Common Sense media suggests the app be used for ages 16+.
