# SNOW DAYS Makeup Days for Missed School Days

As we approach the winter months, it is important to note how snow days may affect the calendar. The Elkhorn Board of Education has built in two makeup days to the calendar in the event that school is canceled due to inclement weather (snow days). These days are scheduled for May 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup>.

May 25<sup>th</sup> will become a vacation day if there are no more than one missed school day. May 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> will both become vacation days if there are no missed school days.

The first two missed days will be made up; in the event of three or more snow days the administration will reevaluate the calendar at that time.

A teacher in-service will be held on the first business day following

the last student day.
