PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE


Welcome to the beautiful days of fall! It's hard to believe that conferences will take place this month. We will once again be using the online site called Pick-A-Time for parents to select a time to meet with the teacher. Detailed information about this process is available in this newsletter. Conferences will be conducted on Tuesday, Oct. 17th and Wednesday, Oct. 18th. Students will be released at 2:06 p.m. on both days.

This year, our professional development during in-service time will focus on the gradual release of responsibility components of effective instruction, which are part of Elkhorn's instructional model. Gradual release is a progression in which teachers gradually do less of the work and students gradually assume increased responsibility. This is sometimes referred to as Focused Instruction (I do it.), Guided Instruction (We do it.), Collaborative Learning (You do it together), and Independent Practice (You do it alone.).

A HUGE thank you goes out to everyone involved in making our Walk-A-Thon and the Fall Family Festival such amazing events! We wouldn't be able to do all of the things we do at Manchester without your time, talents, and financial support. It is such a blessing to be part of such a giving and supportive community.

On Wednesday of Red Ribbon Week, RESPECT, a small theater group, will present a couple of their shows. One of the presentations they will be performing for our 3-5 grade students is called "Between the Lines." The presentation addresses multiple forms of bullying-verbal, physical, social, and cyber--especially within social groups. The program shows the impact on kids who are put in the middle of conflicts between their own friends. Our K-2 students will get the opportunity to watch their "Stop and Think" presentation. This program focuses on the identification of many bullying behaviors and prevention techniques. Students will learn how situations can change and how a person can become empowered if they "stop and think." This program includes interactive scenes in which the students are asked to participate by providing suggestions exercising impulse control to lead to a happy ending.



Regular attendance by students at school is essential for children to obtain the maximum opportunities from the education program offered at Manchester. Parents and students are encouraged to ensure regular and timely attendance at school. Absences from school should be minimized whenever possible.

This year, parents or guardians will receive letters from the school when their child has exceeded 5 absences per quarter. Letters will also be sent home when a child exceeds 10, 15, and 20 days for the entire school year. Meetings with the teacher, counselor and principal maybe set up throughout the year to help solve problems with attendance.

Letters will also be sent home for late arrivals at 10, 15, 20, etc. We know regular school attendance helps to develop habits of punctuality, self- discipline and responsibility along with helping to ensure student success. It is our goal to have all kids accounted for and fully present at the beginning of each school day.

We ask for your cooperation with attendance. Contacting the office when your child is sick or has an appointment is always appreciated.



How can you tell if someone is being bullied?

Joking Around (Not Bullying):

- ·Everyone is having fun.

One Time Thing (Not Bullying):

- ·Someone is being mean on purpose.
- •It's a reaction to a strong emotion or feeling.
- •It happens once and doesn't repeat itself.

Conflict (Not Bullying):

- •Two people with a balance of power that have a fight, argument, or disagreement.
- · A solution can usually be found.

Bullying:

- •Repeated, unwanted aggressive behavior towards someone.
- ·Someone is being hurt on purpose.
- ·It was done intentionally.
- ·Can be social, verbal, physical, or cyber.
- •Imbalance of power.

<u>PICK A TIME--CONFERENCE SCHEDULING</u> DIRECTIONS FOR PARENTS

Manchester uses Pick-a-Time to schedule Parent Teacher Conferences. The online scheduler <u>opens at 10:00 a.m.</u> on Monday, October 2. This is a first-come first-serve scheduling software. As a result, the sooner you register the more likely you are to get your preferred time. In addition, if you have more than one student, it will not allow you to schedule them back-to-back. It will require a fifteen-minute travel time between the two conferences. This allows for travel time and for conferences that have gotten behind schedule. The one exception is if you have children who have the same teacher.

Sign In

If you've previously registered, all you need to do is enter your email address and password. The system will know about your appointments and the children you have added to your account.

Register (kindergarten or students new to Manchester)

- 1. Enter your email address and push "Login/Create Account".
- 2. Fill in the required fields and register.
- 3. For each child, enter your child's first and last name for the student. ID. (example: JohnSmith) and birth date (example: 12/15/2005)

Scheduling

- Each colored square represents an available meeting time. The legend/key shows you what each color means. Click on a square to book that time.
- 2. As an option, you have the choice of setting a time when you would like a reminder email delivered.
- 3. Click "Create Appointment" to finalize.

Repeat until you have a time for each of your children.

- *At any time, you can click on "printable schedule" and print the resulting web page to get a hard copy of your schedule. You will also have the option to email your schedule to yourself.
- *You have the ability to change your conference time through Sunday, October 15^{th} . You will need to log in with the email address and password you used to create your account. If you need to make a change after October 15^{th} , you will need to contact the office at 402-289-2590.
- *Click on "Your Schedule" to display and hide your appointments. There will be links to change the time or cancel the appointment.

Please Note: The art, music, PE, and media teachers are also available for conferences during these times. Our HALE teacher will be at Manchester on Tuesday night only, as she will be at the other building she provides services to on Wednesday. Please feel free to stop in and visit with them during the conference days and times.



SchoolMessenger - Are You Up to Date?

EPS uses a parent messaging system called SchoolMessenger to send emails and phone calls to parents. To ensure you are receiving important messages from your school, be sure to let the office know of any changes to your email addresses or phone numbers.

YouTube - A Guide to Understanding Your Child's Video Watching

YouTube is a common video watching platform used by many youths to find content on subjects that they find interesting or enjoyable to watch. In order to have a better understanding of what your child is watching on YouTube, below is a list of questions that you can ask:

- 1) What's trending today? Trending videos appear on YouTube's home page and show the most recent viral videos, what's funny, and what's being shared. Knowing what's trending will give parents a better understanding of the type of content your child is being exposed to by them simply going to the YouTube home page.
- 2) What channels do you subscribe to? If a child is taking the time to subscribe to a specific channel, it's a guarantee that the content being shown is something of interest to them. Get involved and find out what those channels are, so you can get a better idea of what specific content your child finds interesting and why. This could turn out to be a significant subject area interest for your child and a good common ground topic for conversations.
- 3) What's in your library? One's YouTube library is the place where videos that the user has liked or shared are stored. This too, is a way to discover content that your child finds interesting.
- 4) What was the last video you shared? Youth share things with others only when they find them to be interesting or enjoyable, or they feel that others will enjoy them as well. Get a glimpse into what videos are catching their attention by asking this question.

HEALTH SCREENING TIME IS COMING!

On Monday, November 6th, we will be screening all students in K-4 and 5th grade students who are new to Elkhorn Public Schools for: Height/Weight, Vision, Hearing, and Dental. If a potential issue is identified at the screening, an Elkhorn school nurse will rescreen, and a referral will be sent home at that time. A summary of your student's screening results will be sent home at the end of the school year. We will be sending out at SignUp Genius the first part of this coming week for volunteers to help with the screening.

FLU VACCINES

The CDC recommends getting a flu vaccine before flu begins spreading in your community. It takes about two weeks after vaccination for antibodies to develop in the body that protect against flu, so make plans to get vaccinated early in fall, before flu season begins. CDC recommends that people get a flu vaccine by the end of October, if possible. Getting vaccinated later, however, can still be beneficial and vaccination should continue to be offered throughout the flu season, even into January or later. https://www.cdc.gov/flu/index.htm

OUR PROGRAM

The Elkhorn Public Schools Partners in Education Mentoring Program differs from other mentoring programs in two key ways:

1) Academically-focused: the primary goal of mentors in our program is to assist students with their academic needs and curriculum understanding.

2) Based at school:

all mentoring sessions occur during school hours. This ensures that the focus remains on academics. Mentors are welcome to meet with their mentees outside of school hours if permission is granted by the mentee's guardians.

By focusing primarily on academics, our students are regularly reminded of the importance of education.

THE MENTORING IMPACT

Mentors help keep students in school - studies show that students who meet regularly with their mentors or 52% less likely than their peers to skip a day of school and 37% less likely to skip a class.

Mentors can improve academic skills by assisting in developing positive study habits and growing a passion for learning. The development of these skills increases the likelihood of students going on to pursue a higher education and improves attitudes towards education and learning.

Youth who meet regularly with their mentors see them as role models and are generally 46% less likely than their peers to start using illegal drugs and 27% less likely to start drinking due to a mentor's positive influence.

- Provide academic support at the appropriate level
- Be a positive role model
- Provide guided/independent practice
- Reinforce classroom objectives, skills, and strategies
- ☐ Follow confidentiality guidelines
- Attend weekly sessions with mentee
- Come prepared and be on time
