Kindergarten Round-Up 2018-2019



Elkhorn Public Schools is seeking to identify children who are eligible for kindergarten during the 2018-2019 school year. Parents are encouraged to pre-register their child prior to Kindergarten Round-Up. Children who will be five years of age, on or before July 30, 2018, are eligible to attend kindergarten as stated by Nebraska State Law. Skyline and Blue Sage Kindergarten Round-Up will be held on Friday, March 2 at 9:00 am at Skyline Elementary.. A parent meeting for Skyline families is scheduled for Monday, February 26 at 6:00 pm in the Skyline cafeteria. A parent meeting for Blue Sage families is scheduled for Monday, February 26 at 7:00 pm in the Skyline cafeteria. ### **PLEASE SIGN IN AT THE OFFICE**

### **Cold Weather Reminders and Inclement Weather Alerts**

Please dress your child appropriately for the cold weather. Coats, hats, mittens, and long pants will be needed most days for walking club and recess, as we go outside every day, as long as the "feels like" temperature is 20 degrees or above. It is helpful if you put your child's name in their coats and sweatshirts so we can easily return those items to your child.



School closings will be broadcast over the following radio/television outlets: KFAB (1110), KETV, KMTV and WOWT. Elkhorn families will also receive an announcement via SchoolMessenger, the automated telephone announcement service. If there is no closing announcement broadcast, school will be in session. If severe weather develops during the school day, parents/guardians may pick their children up from school. Parents/guardians always have the option of not sending their children to school on a day when inclement weather is developing or has been forecast.

#### A COLD OR THE FLU?

WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN A COLD AND THE FLU? COLD SYMPTOMS INCLUDE NASAL CONGESTION; A RUNNY, RED AND TENDER NOSE; SCRATCHY OR SORE THROAT; LACK OF APPETITE; AND A LOW GRADE FEVER. A COLD USUALLY LASTS ABOUT 7 DAYS.

THE FLU (SHORT FOR INFLUENZA) IS MORE SEVERE, WITH MANY OF THE COLD SYMPTOMS, BUT USUALLY A HIGHER TEMPERATURE, CHILLS, A COUGH, AND MUSCLE ACHES. ANYONE WITH THESE SYMPTOMS NEEDS TO STAY HOME TO RECOVER AND PREVENT INFECTING OTHERS.

THE BEST PREVENTION IS FREQUENT HAND WASHING. IN ADDITION, USE DISPOSABLE TISSUES, AVOID PEOPLE WHO ARE SICK AND KEEP HANDS AWAY FROM THE MOUTH AND NOSE. AFTER RECOVERY, REPLACING OR STERILIZING YOUR TOOTHBRUSH IS A GOOD IDEA.

THE RECOMMENDED TREATMENT IS LOTS OF REST, LIQUID AND T.L.C. ANTIBIOTICS DON'T HELP BECAUSE COLDS AND FLU ARE CAUSED BY VIRUSES, NOT BACTERIA. OVER-THE-COUNTER MEDICATIONS MAY HELP RELIEVE SYMPTOMS OF CONGESTION AND FEVER. A SORE THROAT CAN BE RELIEVED BY GARGLING WITH ½ TSP OF SALT IN 8 OZ OF WATER. DECONGESTANTS REDUCE NASAL CONGESTION AND EAR FULLNESS. NASAL SPRAYS SHOULDN'T BE USED FOR MORE THAN THREE DAYS OR A REBOUND EFFECT WILL ACTUALLY WORSEN THE CONGESTION. ANTIHISTAMINES WILL DECREASE A RUNNY NOSE, BUT CAN CAUSE DROWSINESS OR EXCITABILITY. COUGH SUPPRESSANTS ARE ONLY GOOD WHEN THE COLD IS CLEARING UP, OTHERWISE AN EXPECTORANT WILL HELP THIN AND CLEAR THE SPUTUM FROM THE THROAT AND CHEST. A VAPORIZER IN THE ROOM WILL HELP THIN SECRETIONS AND RELIEVES HOARSENESS.

CHECK WITH YOUR HEALTHCARE PROVIDER TO MAKE SURE YOUR CHILD'S SYMPTOMS AREN'T A SIGN OF SOMETHING MORE SERIOUS IF HE HAS A TEMPERATURE GREATER THAN 101 DEGREES OR THE FEVER PERSISTS; A VERY SORE OR RED THROAT; PROLONGED COUGH, WHEEZING OR LABORED BREATHING; GREEN COLORED NASAL DRAINAGE, EAR OR SINUS PAIN; OR WHEN SYMPTOMS ARE PROLONGED AND/OR NOT IMPROVING.

YOUR CHILD WILL RECOVER MORE QUICKLY AND COMFORTABLY AT HOME WITH REST, THAN AT SCHOOL. THANK YOU FOR HELPING US PROMOTE A HEALTHY SCHOOL ENVIRONMENT.

Regular, daily attendance at school is the responsibility of each student and his/her parents or guardians. Letters will be sent to parents once a student has been absent 5 days within one quarter, 10 days total and again at 15 days as a reminder of the importance for the child to be in attendance at school every day. A letter will be sent to parents AND possibly the County Attorney if a child accumulates 20 days of absences during the school year with the request to schedule a conference with the building principal.

A child will be recorded tardy if he/she arrives after 8:15 am.

A child will be recorded ½ day absent if he/she arrives after 9:15 am or if he/she leaves before 2:00 pm. A child will be recorded absent for a full day if he/she leaves before 10:00 am and is absent for the remainder of the day.

Please label all items so they can be returned to your child. Just a reminder that any items left at winter break will be donated to charity.

### **Understanding Digital Citizenship**

As Elkhorn Public Schools expands access to technology for instructional purposes, the district is also aware of the need to define digital citizenship and promote the importance of students being good digital citizens. In addition to providing information to students, we believe it may also be helpful to share resources with families. This brochure explains the components of digital citizenship as well as some best practices for being a good digital citizen. ### Internet Safety and Privacy

Several topics are vital to ensuring full understanding of the importance of safe Internet practices:

- Identify risky online situations and explain the importance of alerting and adult immediately
- Secure all devices, both hand-held and stationary and develop high quality passwords
- Understand the dangers of downloads and how they are used as part of your digital footprint
- Identify appropriate information that can be shared. Most importantly, those using the Internet should always remember there is no such thing as total privacy online.

### Digital Footprint, Communication and Reputation

Individuals utilizing the Internet and social media must understand that all online activity leaves a digital footprint in the form of information that exists about an individual as a result of their online activity. Because this information is easily linked to a specific individual, it can oftentimes be used to harm a person's reputation, even outside of the cyber world. Individuals should remember that what they are putting out there today will still be available for years to come. Being aware of this may be the difference between being hired for your dream job, and being passed over due to unflattering information that was discovered from one's use of an online platform earlier in life. For those wanting to clean up their digital footprint and move forward with creating a positive one, the following steps should be considered:

 Review all social media accounts and delete anything that you wouldn't want a future employer to access, but remember that even "deleted" posts can still turn up in searches so always think twice before posting anything; once that step is complete, turn all settings to private and monitor the settings regularly, as sites often update their settings and some things could change without your knowledge.

- Delete abandoned accounts and unsubscribe to mailing lists that might be considered undesirable or that you no longer find relevant.
- Post about topics you're passionate about and explain why you feel that way; find positive things happening around you and share those instead of today's most viral video.

### Creative Credit and Copyright

There are several ways to ensure proper credit is given and copyright is protected when using information gathered online; the most important of those being correctly citing sources, avoiding plagiarism, and always checking any images used for creator's rights.

### Information Literacy

Information literacy is a term often associated with understanding the tools used to gather information and knowing where that information is coming from. Individuals utilizing the Internet for research should always be sure that the information they are collecting is accurate and reliable by verifying the credibility of any website utilized in the information collection process.

#### **Balancing Technology Use**

Parents often look for new ways to create a balance between learning and using technology appropriately, and participating in other activities that are essential to a child's development. Finding that balance between the two can be the difference between a healthy relationship and an unhealthy reliance. Several strategies exist to ensure that a healthy relationship with technology is built beginning with the early stages of use. ### Understand Your Pattern of Use and Create Boundaries

Most people don't realize the amount of time they spend using technology unless it is pointed out to them. Take an inventory of your family's use and understand when, why, and how you're using technology. Is all of it necessary? Are you and/or your family benefiting from that time spent with technology? Understanding your pattern of use is the first step in creating boundaries that both you and your family can stick to.

### Be Intentional in Determining Downtime

Being constantly connected can hinder active learning, as one becomes passive in taking in new information because he or she is constantly "learning" new things. Taking a step away from technology and the absorption of information allows one's brain a needed break and creates an active learning environment. By being intentional in determining technology downtime, you are giving your brain that break to be able to focus on other things.

### Be the Example and Set the Expectation

Kids learn by following an example - following the same technology use rules you set for your children is the best way to show them a healthy relationship with technology. Setting usage time limits, creating intentional face-to-face opportunities, and implementing device-free zones are all ways to ensure too much time isn't spent on technology for entertainment purposes.
