## Parenting Pathways

### What is Anger?

Anger is a natural emotion that children, as well as adults, experience when they are feeling frustrated, overwhelmed or are unable to express their needs or desires effectively. Anger may manifest as screaming, hiding, stomping, crying, or even a full tantrum. It may be hard to understand or accept that this is a completely normal part of childhood development, but it aids in brain development. During these outbursts, adults must remember that a child's brain is continually under construction and needs guidance to help effectively manage big emotions.


#### What can a parent do to help meltdowns?

- . Model the behavior you want to see
  - Children are always watching. How parents and adults handle angry feelings around a child is how the child will learn to manage their own.
- Validate their feelings
  - "I saw that Lincoln took your toy. That made you feel really angry. It's okay to feel angry." Allow the child to understand that they are allowed to be upset and that you will be there to help them work through it. Then, move forward and offer choices if the child is calm enough.
- · Teach emotional awareness
  - Identifying for the child what angry looks like including a red or sweaty face, scrunched face, and tight fists. You can also discuss what it feels like such as a racing heart, tight body, headache, or upset stomach. Practicing in the mirror so they can see themselves is highly effective.
- Create a safe environment
- Create a calm corner at home!
- Open communication
  - For example, "Mommy got really frustrated at work today. I could feel my heart beating faster and
    my body felt tight. I knew that I could calm my body down by taking deep breaths. So I took three
    deep breaths and was able to feel comfortable again. What about you? What feelings did your body
    feel today?"
- Seek professional help
- After using strategies consistently, if you are not able to see improvements, asking a professional for help is a great option. Therapists and counselors can work with the individual child as well as the family to help manage and calm big emotions.

## SOM Character Trait

You can help your child with empathy by helping them with perspective-taking.

- How did the other person feel?
- How can your actions change their feeling?
- What can you do if someone is sad?



## Try it! Create a Calm Corner!

Just like adults, kids need an outlet for managing their strong feelings in a comforting and safe environment. Create child friendly space, defined as a "calm corner." In a calm corner, you could include pillows, coloring sheets, fidget toys, playdough, and other calm-down tools along with breathing posters and books. A calm corner should NOT be a timeout space or used as a punishment, but instead a safe place for emotional regulation. Once this space is set up in the home, an adult will need to teach the child how and when to use this space appropriately. As with anything, practice will help solidify a routine for effective use of the space.

EPS is currently seeking to fill open teacher assistant positions, specifically in the following areas:


- Secondary TA: assist with general and special education students in grades 6-12 in the areas of small and large group academic work, academic interventions, student supervision, and basic clerical duties.
