## NSCAS TESTING TIMELINE



All students in grades three through eight, as well as 11th grades, will take part in NSCAS (Nebraska Student Centered Assessment System). Results from the NSCAS will be used to identify strengths and areas of need across the district, as well as for each individual student. It is important that your student(s) be present during these assessments in order to get an accurate snapshot of their level of mastery in relation to state standards. These results will also allow our teaching staff to guide classroom instruction based on areas of need. Listed below are the scheduled dates for the NSCAS assessments at Spring Ridge. 


# 2024-25 Kindergarten and New Student Registration


#### **Total Solar Eclipse**

As some of you may be aware, a total solar eclipse will cross North America on Monday, April 8. While Nebraska is outside of the path of totality, we will experience about 80% of the sun being blocked by the moon at approximately 1:55 p.m. This event will be both educational and historical for our students to witness, as an eclipse with this level of visibility has not occurred since 2017.

District science teachers and administrative staff have been busy preparing for the event by ordering special glasses for all students to be able to view the eclipse, as well as preparing learning materials and resources for staff to adequately engage students at all grade levels in this event. Some schedules will also be adjusted in order to allow for participation and viewing.

While all staff will be trained on safety measures to be taken in regards to protecting all students, there is a potential for retinal injury by viewing the eclipse directly, when done without the protection of the glasses. Due to this possibility, we are requiring positive parent permission for students to participate. A parent permission slip will be sent home in late March. If you have any questions or concerns regarding this event, please feel free to contact your child's principal.







Thank you for keeping your child home when they don't feel well. CHILDREN SHALL BE EXCLUDED FROM SCHOOL FOR THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:

- Contagious diseases such as chickenpox, measles, mumps, pink eye, etc.
  - Skin eruptions or suspicious rash
  - Vomiting and/or diarrhea
- Abnormal temperature (Elkhorn Public Schools complies with the Douglas County Health Department recommendation that a child may not stay at school if temperature is 100 degrees or more and should not return to school until fever-free for 24 hours.)
- Head lice

A child absent from school because of a skin disease or other infectious or contagious disease may be required to present a statement from a doctor upon returning to school.

#### -Health Screens-

If your student received a referral letter after health screenings, please follow-up with the appropriate health care provider and return completed referral forms to the school. **This is not required**. Referrals are meant to bridge the gap between regular health check-ups.

#### It's not too early to start scheduling your school and sports physicals!



 Students who will be entering Kindergarten in the fall or who are new students from out of state will need to submit a physical exam and vision exam (including tests for strabismus, amblyopia, and acuity) dated after February 13, 2024, as well as a current immunization record

including the Kindergarten booster shots. Here is the <u>Summary of the School</u> <u>Immunization Rules and Regulations</u>

\*\*Health records should be submitted to school <u>prior</u> to the first student day on August 13, 2024.


