NSCAS TESTING TIMELINE

All students in grades three through eight, as well as 11th grades, will take part in NSCAS (Nebraska Student Centered Assessment System). Results from the NSCAS will be used to identify strengths and areas of need across the district, as well as for each individual student. It is important that your student(s) be present during these assessments in order to get an accurate snapshot of their level of mastery in relation to state standards. These results will also allow our teaching staff to guide classroom instruction based on areas of need. Listed below are the scheduled dates for the NSCAS assessments at Spring Ridge. Note from the Nurse...



Thank you for keeping your child home when they don't feel well. CHILDREN SHALL BE EXCLUDED FROM SCHOOL FOR THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:

- Contagious diseases such as chickenpox, measles, mumps, pink eye, etc.
 - Skin eruptions or suspicious rash
 - Vomiting and/or diarrhea
 - Abnormal temperature (Elkhorn Public Schools

complies with the Douglas County Health Department recommendation that a child may not stay at school if temperature is 100 degrees or more and should not return to school until fever-free for 24 hours.)

- Head lice

A child absent from school because of a skin disease or other infectious or contagious disease may be required to present a statement from a doctor upon returning to school (Guidelines under student handbook).

5th grade health talks will be taking place on Thursday, April 17th. Girls will begin
at 1:30pm and boys will follow at 2:15pm. Parents who attend the lesson are
asked only to observe. If you have any questions or concerns or would like to
view the video, please feel free to contact me or the school office.



It's not too early to start scheduling your school and sports physicals!

 Students who will be entering Kindergarten in the fall or who are new students from out of state will need to submit a physical exam <u>and</u> vision exam (including tests for strabismus, amblyopia, and acuity) dated after February 12,

2025. A current immunization record including recent Kindergarten booster shots is also required. Here is the <u>Summary of the School Immunization Rules</u> and <u>Regulations</u>.

 5th grade students wanting to participate in a sport at the middle school level must have a sports physical completed sometime after May 1, 2025 and uploaded to <u>rschool</u>.

**Health records should be submitted to school <u>prior</u> to the first student day on August 12, 2025.

Parenting Pathways

Teaching Courage at Home

Courage isn't just about being brave in big moments—it's about trying new things, standing up for what's right, and facing challenges with confidence. Parents and caregivers can help children build courage in everyday life through small but meaningful actions.

- Encourage New Experiences Let kids try new foods, activities, or hobbies, praising their effort rather than the outcome.
- Model Courage Share stories of times you've faced fears or challenges and how you overcame them.
- Practice Speaking Up Role-play situations where kids can express their feelings, ask for help, or stand up for others.
- Celebrate Mistakes as Learning Teach kids that mistakes are part of growth and not something to fear.
- Read Books About Courage Stories like The Story of Ruby Bridges by Robert Coles or Jabari Jumps by Gaia Cornwall show courage in action.

With encouragement and practice, kids will grow more confident in facing life's challenges with bravery and resilience!


