Question of the Month

What is MAP testing and why is it done three times a year?



MAP stands for Measures of Academic Progress. It is an online test that is adaptive to the students as they take the test. As students answer questions correctly on the test, the test will give the students harder and harder questions. Some students will see problems on their test that they may have not been taught or even seen before. That is okay. As students answer questions incorrectly, the test will give the students easier questions. This process allows the assessment to find a student's RIT score. The RIT score is an overall score of how the student did on the test. These scores are compared to national norms and allow us to look at students' percentile rank. The percentile allows us see where students performed compared to peers around the nation. For example, a student that was at the 50 percentile scored better than half of all the other students that took the same test.

We do these assessments to measure growth over the course of a year. We want to see growth in each individual student's RIT score. MAP testing also gives us projections about where students should be scoring by the end of the year. By doing the test in the winter, it allows us to see if students are making adequate progress towards their goals. MAP testing is a great tool for us to use to monitor students not only within each school year, but also from year to year as the RIT scores are consistent from grade level to grade level. If you have any specific questions about your son/daughter's MAP assessment result, you can always reach out to your classroom teacher or myself. We would be more than happy to discuss the results with you in more detail.

Internet Safety Tips

Taking an active role in protecting your kids from Internet predators and explicit materials is vital to keeping them safe. Below are some helpful tips and ways parents can stay involved and aware in order to ensure their children's safety online.

- Become computer literate and learn how to block questionable material.
- Keep the computer in a common area, not in individual bedrooms, where you can watch and monitor its use.
- Share an email account with your child so you can monitor messages.
- Bookmark kids' favorite sites for easy access.
- Spend time online together to teach your kids appropriate online behavior.
- Block private chat rooms by using safety features provided by your Internet service provider or with special filtering software. Be aware that posting messages to chat rooms reveals a user's email address to others.
- Take your child seriously if he or she reports an uncomfortable online exchange.
- Forward copies of obscene or threatening messages you or your kids get to your Internet service provider.
- Call the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children at (800) 843-5678 if you're aware of the transmission, use, or viewing of child pornography online. Contact your local law enforcement agency or the FBI if your child has received child pornography via the Internet.
- Ask your Internet service provider about disabling "cookies" that track specific user information including a user's name and email address.

Keeping children safe online is an on-going task that requires diligence in the monitoring of online activities and usage. In order to best protect them, parents must remain vigilant and always know what their child is doing online.

While parents know that nearly all mobile devices used today have the ability to send and receive text messages, they may not fully understand that beyond that inherent, built-in ability, students are also able to download additional apps that are specifically used for sending and receiving text messages. Below are some popular texting apps and concerns that are linked to their use. For more information on any of these apps, please visit: www.commonsensemedia.org.

- GroupMe: allows individual and group messages with no user fees or limits. Users are able to send and receive photos, videos, and calendar links.
 - o Concern: embedded GIFs included in the app have adult themes that are not suitable for children under the age of 18.
- Kik Messenger: ability to send and receive limitless messages that do not show up on an individual's phone messaging service
 - o Concern: allows users the ability to connect with anyone who shares their Kik username, opening up the pathway for online predators
