Principal's Message

Hello Westridge Families,

Winters in Nebraska are always interesting. The snow, ice, and cold can make for some dangerous conditions. School closing can be an inconvenience, but the most important priority is the safety of our students, families, and staff. When school is closed, the specials schedule does not change. For example Wednesday, Jan 30th was an E day. This means that whether we have school or not Thursday, Jan 31st is still going to be an A day. No matter how many school cancelation days we have the ABC calendar online will always be correct.

We will be making up two days due to the school cancelations. We have added school on Thursday, May 23rd and Friday, May 24th. Friday, May 24th will be the last day of school even if there are more school cancelations. The 23rd will be a C day, and the 24th will be a D day. Those additions have been added to the online calendar.

The window to schedule Parent/Teacher conferences is now open. Directions on how to get online to schedule your conference can be found later in the newsletter. If you have any trouble get online to schedule your conference, please call the office at 402-289-2559.

Finally, we will be having our Valentine's Day parties on Friday, February 8th. Students are welcome to bring valentines for their classmates as well as a decorated box for the party. We will be having a school wide event that afternoon. Then students will have time to hand out and look through their valentines. PTO will provide a treat for students during the parties.

WHEN IS MY CHILD TOO SICK FOR SCHOOL?

Proper care in the early stages of an illness can reduce recovery time for the ill child and reduce the possibility of spreading the illness to others. Proper diet, adequate rest, and good personal hygiene (especially frequent handwashing) can assist the body's ability to fight infection.

The following are guidelines to assist you in deciding when your child should stay home from school: Irritability, poor appetite, tiredness, achiness are vague symptoms. Changes in a child's normal behavior can often signal the beginning of an illness. Fever of 100 degrees or higher. Take your child's temperature if he is complaining of feeling tired, headache, sore throat or stomach ache. A child should be fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medication before returning to school.

Nausea, **vomiting**, **or diarrhea**. Keep your child at home for the duration of these symptoms. No vomiting or diarrhea for the past 24 hours is recommended. Be sure your child is able to tolerate food without difficulty before returning.

Nasal secretions and coughing/sneezing spread respiratory infections easily when these symptoms can't be controlled.

Suspected communicable conditions such as undiagnosed rashes, pink eye, ringworm, or chickenpox. A child must be sent home until identified symptoms are evaluated and conditions for return to school are provided by a health care provider.

Both concerts will in in the gym. 2nd graders need to meet at 5:45 in the music room and 3rd graders need to meet at 6:45 in the music room. Please do not arrive earlier than that time or have students stay with their families until the meeting time, since supervision will not be available until then. Please be patient between concerts as some families will be leaving and others will be settling in. Each program will be about 30 minutes long. Parents of Current 5th-8th Grade Students

In recent years we have heard from parents that students are spending more and more time at home doing school work with their family computers. As part of the EPS 5-Year Instructional Technology Plan approved by the school board in October 2016, next year's 6th-8th grade students (current 5th-7th grade students) will receive an individual Chromebook for educational use next fall. In addition, all high school students will continue to receive a Chromebook next school year. Therefore, current 8th grade students will receive an individual Chromebook for education to 9th grade. Please note, current 8th grade students will receive a different Chromebook than the one they used during the 18-19 school year.

The district is finding that much of our educational content requires access to technology, and Chromebooks allow us a cost-effective way to assure that students have this access when it is needed. As part of this initiative, parents of 2019-2020 sixth, seventh and eighth grade students are encouraged to attend an orientation either during Back to School 101 or Open House in August. The exact dates for these orientations are not yet set, but the district wanted to begin communication with parents of current 5th-8th grade students. We are very excited about providing a computing device for these students next school year.

Register (new users)

- 1. Enter your email address and push "Login/Create Account".
- 2. Fill in the required fields and register.

Sign In

If you've previously registered, all you need to do is enter your email and password. If you have forgotten your password, you can select the Forgot Password button and a new password will be emailed to you. For each child, enter your child's first and last name (ex: johnsmith) and birth date (ex: 12/15/2005).

The on-line scheduler will open up at <u>9:00 a.m. on Monday, January 28th and</u> <u>close at 11:59 p.m. on Sunday, February 10th.</u>

Scheduling

- 1. You will see a list of teachers. Select the box next to the teacher name(s) that you would like to schedule a conference with. You will then see the schedule of available times for that teacher.
- 2. Each colored square represents an available meeting time. The legend shows you which teacher corresponds to which color and the times increase as you go down the page.
- 3. Click on a square to schedule that time.
- 4. You will optionally have the choice of whether you would like an email reminder to be delivered, and you will be prompted to enter in the name of your student.
- 5. Click on "Create Appointment".
- 6. Repeat until you have a time with each teacher you'd like to visit with.
 - You can click on the "**Printable Schedule**" link located on the top right corner and print the resulting web page to get a hard copy of your schedule. You will also have the option to email the schedule to yourself.
 - If you want to make changes to your schedule you can click on the "**Your Schedule**" link, OR you can login at any other time with your email and password.

Please Note: Specialists are also available for conferences during these times. Please feel free to stop in and visit with them during the conference days and times.
