We will be doing full distance learning for all EPS students from Monday, November 30th through Friday, December 4th. The building schedule can be found here. Please remember if you child will not be able attend the zoom session with his/her class, you will still need to call in and notify the office of the absence. Also, please be sure to continue to communicate any direct exposures or positive COVID-19 cases during the distance learning week. We have Westridge students that are registered as remote learners who are allowed to zoom into their classes daily. The reasons a student may be a remote learner are:

- The family has chosen remote learning for the semester.
- A student is showing symptoms or has tested positive for COVID-19 and while on a school quarantine has chosen to register as a remote learner.
- A student has been exposed to a person who has tested positive for COVID-19 and while on a school quarantine has chosen to register as a remote learner.

 - 2. **Distance Learning Schedule:** A detailed schedule can be found on the Westridge website, under News, Newsletter, Plan E Schedule – Westridge Elementary. You will note that this schedule is different than the one in the spring as there is more time with teachers. 9am - Noon will be teachers zooming with the students and then in the afternoon there will be time with specials. Please note that there will be small group instruction built into the schedule so that each child has more interaction in a smaller group with their teacher. This will mostly be done for reading and writing. Teachers will be reaching out and communicating with families the times and what group their child is in. We expect to have all individual classroom schedules released to families by Friday, November 20th at the latest. During E-Learning there will not be enrichment (K-3rd) but there will be HALE (4th and 5th). Any students with IEP's in place will also be receiving information from the supplemental instructors with additional zoom times. If we were to move into full remote learning for longer than 10 days, the schedule would change slightly, but we will cross that bridge if we get to it.

b. President's Report:

- 1. Thankful for Westridge Staff Campaign In the month of November, we are having "Thankful Thursday" and surprising the teachers with various items each week. Last Thursday, we had new coffee and tea choices, creamer, as well as disposable to-go cups for the teachers. We have other fun items in the upcoming weeks to show staff how much they are appreciated and how much we are thankful for them.
- 2. Photo Contest Wrap Up We had 19 participants in the photo contest. Students were able to vote at school and via the text message link. Ballots were hand counted and the winners have been notified. Thank you again for all who participated!

c. Vice President's Report:

d. Treasurer's Report:

 Financials and overview of October – We did not use money allocated in the Directory and Taxes funds, so we have roughly \$1,100 that we have reallocated to "Thankful Thursdays" and the Fall Photo contest. We received \$174.64 between the Kona Ice and Jimmy John's fundraisers. A late Walk-athon Donation from EAA of \$250 was deposited as well as the overall Walk-athon check of \$18,087.75.
